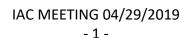

There was no public comment.

IAC Correspondence:

Wicomico County submitted written testimony to the Chair and Members of the IAC regarding their Capital Improvement Program allocations and their needs for further funding from the Built to Learn Act of 2020.





1. Consent Agenda – [Motion Carried]

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second by Mr. Lombardo, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda.

A. Approval of the February 11, 2021 Minutes

To approve the minutes of the February 11, 2021 Interagency Commission on School Construction Meeting.

B. Summary of Contract Awards

To approve contract procurement as presented.

C. Approval of Revisions to Previously Approved Contracts

To approve the revisions to previously approved contract awards to accurately reflect the adjusted reversion amounts as presented.

D. Project Closeouts

To approve the final State project costs as presented and to remove the projects from the active project detailed financial report.

E. Approval of Change Orders

The presented statistical information is for Change Order Letters dated February 08, 2021 to be included in the March 4, 2021 Outgoing Agenda for IAC Meeting approval of Contracts & Items, with an approval date of March 11, 2021. This item is informational and does not require IAC Action.

F. Amendment to January 14, 2021 Minutes

To revise the January 14th, 2021 Minutes Executive Session language to include: "The IAC discussed the performance evaluation of an employee."

2. IAC Impact of the Built to Learn Act of 2020 - [Informational Only]

Cassandra Viscarra, Program Support Manager for the IAC, delivered a presentation on the Built to Learn Act, which recently took effect, with a brief overview on the portions of the bill that impact IAC Operations and Programs.

The bill allows the Maryland Stadium Authority to sell bonds of up to \$2.2 Billion to fund Public School Construction. The amount actually sold will be dependent upon the cash available each year for debt service. Statute does require that certain LEAs receive specific percentages of the revenue, which can be found on page 29 of the Agenda. The program will be governed by an MOU between the IAC and MSA.

The IAC is required to approve Built to Learn Act funding allocations on a rolling basis, as opposed to annual allocations. The first projects that are to receive this rolling funding should be CIP "B" status projects. This funding cannot reimburse a facility that has already been completed, but can reimburse projects that began after June 1, 2020.

Cassandra described other provisions of the legislation, including revisions to the Enrollment Growth and Relocatable Classroom Program threshold, provision for a Public Private Partnership agreement in Prince George's County, an evaluation of the life cycle costs of public school facilities, and the adoption of a Computerized Maintenance Management System by the IAC.

Lastly, Cassandra explained impacts on some of the IAC's ongoing programs and Workgroups, such as the Assessment and Funding Workgroup deadlines, the extension of the Healthy School Facility Fund Program, the development of a CTE program with apprenticeships in school building maintenance, and the creation of the Public School Facilities Priority fund. The Priority Fund uses the results of the Statewide Facilities Assessment to address facilities with the highest needs. This program will be allocated \$40 Million per year in FY25 and FY26, and will be allocated \$80 Million every year after.



3. Adoption of Proposed COMAR Revisions, Including FY23 and FY24 State Cost Shares – [Motion Carried]*

Before the Item was presented, IAC Member Linda Eberhart expressed three points of concern with the item: 1) LEA comments had not yet been received at the time of presentation of the proposal to the IAC, 2) the priorities of the President of the Senate and House Speaker during this session are not yet fully known, and 3) the pandemic is changing rapidly, and waiting another month will provide a clearer outlook. Dr. Salmon clarified that this would only advance a proposal of changes, and that this would only begin the process of notice and comment before any amendment of the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR). Director Gorrell further clarified that adoption of the item would begin the Public Review process, and that feedback would be provided to the IAC before final adoption and implementation.

Cassandra Viscarra highlighted the proposed revisions in the item, which were designed to comply with the Built to Learn Act of 2020, and include the proposed new State Cost shares as calculated by the formula in COMAR 14.39.02.05.

The primary proposed change is to modify regulations to allow funding of planning and design as required by the Built to Learn Act of 2020. IAC Staff wanted to maximize LEA flexibility, so instead of replacing the locally-funded design option, we have added to it a state-funded design option. IAC staff added the requirements for planning and design funding approval, found in section B1. Page 47 includes minor changes to cross-references, and page 49 includes further clarifications to allow for design funding. Page 51 lays out the allocation for planning and design funding, which cannot exceed 10% of the anticipated eligible project amount. The regulation also modified the current eligible and ineligible expenditures to make design and planning expenses eligible for State funding. Other modifications include updates to cross-references and minor technical changes.

Deputy Director of Administration, Kim Spivey presented proposed FY 2023 and FY 2024 State and Local Cost Shares for each county. Kim briefly described the factors used in the State formula, in accordance with COMAR 14.39.02.05. Overall, the proposed State cost shares include 8 LEAs with an increase in their State Cost Share, 11 counties that stay the same, and 5 counties that see a decrease. No LEA will receive more than a 5% reduction in their State Cost Share per year, as required by COMAR.

Members expressed strong concern with some calculated reductions, including the 9% decrease over two years for Baltimore City. Chair Salmon noted that we have historically deferred decreases in State Cost Share, and have been advised that changes in the Built to Learn Act of 2020 block the IAC's ability to modify the calculated cost shares to hold harmless LEAs that would experience a decrease. Deputy Director Spivey noted that last time the State and Local Cost Share was calculated, there was a 10% Tier 1 County add-on for Baltimore City based on the unemployment and median household criteria thresholds, whereas this year there was only a 5% Tier 1 County add-on for Baltimore City based on median household criteria.

Members further discussed the implications of the State Cost share adoption and expressed hesitation to act without additional information. Secretary McCord noted that other provisions noted in the proposed regulatory changes could be approved for submission to the Division of State Documents, while adoption of the State cost shares could be postponed. Members agreed to postpone adoption of the State Cost share and directed staff to return to the April meeting with additional information and options. The members modified the staff proposed motion to exclude adoption of proposed amendments to COMAR 14.39.02.05.

Upon a motion from Ms. Lawlah and a second by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve and amended motion to approve a proposed COMAR change to:



- **1.** recodify existing regulations 14.39.02.08, .09, .13, .16, .19, and .21—.30 to be Regulations 14.39.02.09, .10, .14, .17, .20, and .22—.31, respectively, and
- 2. to approve amendments to COMAR 14.39.02.03, .05*, .06,
- **3.** to amend and recodify existing regulations 14.39.02.10, .11, .12, .14, .15, .17, .18, and .20, to be Regulations 14.39.02.11, .12, .13, .15, .16, .18, .19, and .21, respectively, and
- 4. adopt new Regulation 14.39.02.08 Early Planning and Design Funding Allocation, and
- 5. to authorize staff to make additional technical edits as necessary.

Secretary McCord suggested that IAC Staff examine a county by county cost per pupil comparison in funding and include this research in future information presented to the IAC.

4. Washington County Public Schools Amendment to the Approved State FY 2021 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) – [Motion Carried]

Arabia Davis, Funding Programs Manager for the IAC, presented amendments to the FY21 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) allocations for Washington County Public Schools (WCPS) for the Western Heights Middle roof project, and the North Hagerstown High chiller project. WCPS has requested that the IAC allow \$736,000 in State FY 2021 funding originally allocated but not needed to complete the Western Heights Middle School Roof replacement project to be transferred to fully fund a revised State share on the North Hagerstown High School Chiller replacement project. The realignment of funding in WCPS FY 2021 CIP is needed to avoid the chiller project from being deferred due to lack of available local funding.

Director Gorrell mentioned that this follows what IAC staff have encouraged in Baltimore City, which is to be able to shift money from prior allocations to keep important projects moving. As such, IAC Staff is in support of the proposed amendments.

Upon a motion from Ms. Lawlah and a second by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve an amendment to the Washington County Public School's (WCPS) FY 2021 CIP project allocations for the:

- 1. Western Heights Middle School roof replacement project decreasing the allocation from \$1,873,000 to \$1,051,000;
- 2. North Hagerstown High School chiller replacement project increasing the allocation from \$711,000 to \$1,447,000, and;
- 3. Revert \$86,000 to the reserved appropriation account for WCPS.

5. Nonpublic Project Approvals and Allocations

Fred Mason, School Facilities Branch Chief, presented nonpublic project approvals and allocations items to the IAC.

A. Nonpublic Schools Safety Grants Program – FY 2021 Project Approvals and Allocations – [Motion Carried]

Branch Chief Mason presented the proposed FY21 allocations for the Nonpublic Schools Safety Grant Program, totaling \$3,496,260. The Nonpublic School Safety Grant Program, jointly administered by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) and the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC), provides grants for nonpublic schools to renovate and improve school facilities for safety improvements. Nonpublic schools participating in MSDE's Aid to Nonpublic Schools Textbook Loan Program are eligible for the grants. Facilities must be 16 years or more of age.



A nonpublic school meeting the basic requirements may receive a minimum grant of \$5,000, with a maximum grant of \$65 per student for schools where less than 20% of the students are eligible for free and reduced price meal programs, or a maximum grant of \$85 per student where more than 20% of the students are eligible for free and reduced price meal programs.

Mr. Lombardo asked if the several hundred schools eligible for these grants are monitored to verify the expenditures are being implemented accordingly. Mr. Mason clarified that while there is no physical examination, there is an extensive review process which includes proof that they paid their contractors for the completion of the work before the reimbursements are improved. Ms. Eberhart asked if the schools that qualify via the Textbook Loan Program adhere to the anti-discrimination assurances as required under the Textbook Loan Program, and Mr. Mason confirmed that all comply.

Upon a motion from Mr. Lombardo and a second by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC members voted unanimously to approve FY 2021 Nonpublic Schools Safety Grants Program project allocations as presented, totaling \$3,496,260.

B. Nonpublic Aging Schools Program – FY 2021 Project Approvals and Allocations – [Motion Carried]

Fred presented the FY21 allocations for the Nonpublic Aging Schools Program (NASP), totaling \$3,499,578. The NASP provides grants of general obligation bond proceeds to nonpublic schools to renovate and improve school facilities. These grants provide funds for projects in buildings at least 16 years of age that would have been eligible under the Aging Schools Program if they were public schools. Nonpublic schools participating in MSDE's Aid to Nonpublic Schools Textbook Loan Program are eligible for the grants. Also, eligible are nonpublic schools serving students with disabilities through the Nonpublic Placement Program, R00A02.07 Subprogram 076.

A nonpublic school meeting basic requirements may receive a minimum grant of \$5,000. The amount of the actual grant is based on additional criteria: Tuition is less than the Statewide average per pupil expenditure for public schools; At least 20% of the students are eligible for free and reduced price meal programs; The school facility has an average age of 50 years or more. The statutory maximum funding level for schools meeting one criterion is \$25,000; for two additional criteria, the maximum allocation is \$75,000; and for three additional criteria the maximum grant amount is \$100,000. Due to the large number of qualified applicants, the actual allocations are pro-rated. The funding levels are \$7,641, \$22,923, and \$30,564.

Ms. Eberhart asked the same question as asked in the prior item, regarding anti-discrimination assurances as required under the Textbook Loan Program. Mr. Mason again confirmed that these schools all comply. Secretary McCord mentioned that there is a need for enrollment data for nonpublic schools for planning purposes. Mr. Mason noted that IAC staff receive enrollment information as part of the NASP application process, but only for schools that apply for the funding. IAC staff do not have information relating to enrollments at other nonpublic schools.

Upon a motion from Mr. Felder and a second by Secretary McCord, the IAC Members voted unanimously to approve FY 2021 Senator James E. "Ed" DeGrange Nonpublic Aging Schools Program project allocations as presented, totaling \$3,499,578.



6. Baltimore City Roland Park PK-8 Approval COMAR Waiver and Allocation of Emergency Planning Funding – [Motion Carried]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager for Baltimore City, presented an approval of a COMAR waiver and a transfer of \$76,800 for emergency structural repair funding at Roland Park PK-8.

The structural issues at Roland Park PK-8 #233 have been clear to Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) and to State maintenance inspectors since at least 2015, when State inspectors observed and documented them. City Schools included a structural investigation and repair project as priority #37 in its FY 2020 CIP request, as priority #27 in its FY 2021 request and as priority #6 in its FY 2022 CIP request — submitted in October 2020. Each time, the project has been deferred due to insufficient scope development. Without a detailed structural investigation with potential solutions and budgets identified prior to allocation of state funds for construction, the risk is high that the estimated requested state allocation will not be sufficient to complete the scope and that the project will need to be cancelled. Any such cancellation and reversion of funds would come at a financial cost (due to construction-cost escalation) to the State and to City Schools. It would also come at an educational cost to the students. In light of this, IAC staff support and recommend the approval of emergency funds for design.

Upon a motion from Ms. Lawlah and a second from Mr. Lombardo, the IAC voted unanimously to approve:

- 1. the waiver of COMAR 14.39.02.11C, as requested by Baltimore City Public Schools and approved by the Assistant Attorney General for legal sufficiency, so that design funding will be an eligible expense for an emergency structural repair project at Roland Park PK-8; and
- the transfer of \$76,800 from the Emergency Repair Fund to establish an allocation for professional design services for early planning for an emergency structural repair project at the Roland Park PK-8.

7. Baltimore City Public Schools — Cancellation of FY 2020 Southside Building #181 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) Project – [Motion Carried]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager for Baltimore City, presented the cancellation of the Baltimore City Public Schools FY 2020 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) vertical packaged air conditioning units at Southside Building #181, and the transfer of the project allocation for this project for reallocation to other eligible projects under the HSFF.

The Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) Administrative Procedures Guide requires project allocations uncontracted after final reimbursement of an approved project to be transferred back to the Fund and reserved for reallocation to other eligible HSFF projects in the state. Per the submitted letter dated November 19, 2020, City Schools requested the cancellation of the one FY 2020 HSFF project because City Schools does not intend to complete the project.

At the January 14, 2021 meeting of the IAC, a motion to approve the request to cancel the project was postponed and more information on the project and the building were requested. In particular, members wanted to know that school #181 is safe, if the VPU project at school #181 could be completed, and of City Schools' long-term plan for school #181. City Schools provided immediate assurance that school #181 is safe, and in particular, that the fire alarm is operational. Since then, staff confirmed that City Schools does not intend to complete the project. Staff recommends approval of the request to cancel the FY 2020 Healthy School Facility Fund project — the installation of VPUs at the Southside Building #181 — and to transfer the project allocation of \$896,682 as detailed in the motion.

Upon a motion from Mr. Kasemeyer and a second from Mr. Lombardo, the motion to approve the cancellation of the Baltimore City Public Schools FY 2020 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) vertical packaged air conditioning units project at Southside Building #181, and the transfer of the project allocation



of \$896,682 to the Healthy School Facility Fund for reallocation to other eligible Healthy School Facility Fund projects in the State was approved unanimously.

Dr. Salmon expressed that after her visit to this facility, she is happy that this facility is being reviewed and brought before the IAC, but hopes that Baltimore City staff are still seeking a better solution for this facility than is currently available.

8. Baltimore City E15M HVAC Project Status Report - [Informational Only]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager, presented a status report on the Baltimore City E15M HVAC allocation. Jamie noted that 12 of the 19 projects are operational, 2 projects are more than two months behind schedule, 4 projects are just about on schedule, and 1 project is five months ahead of schedule. Jamie also reported that, to date, \$13.5 million (about 90%) of the program funds have been contracted, and \$7.1 million (close to 50%) have been expended. Secretary McCord expressed admiration for the amount of work that Baltimore City has put into these projects.

In closing remarks, Chair Salmon stated that she had recently been in St. Mary's County, touring Green Holly Elementary School, and got to see the new standing seam metal roof with a 30-50 year lifespan. Chair Salmon observed that not only does it look beautiful, but it is great to see the work of the IAC coming to fruition with Total Cost of Ownership being taken into consideration. Lastly, Dr. Salmon noted that there were two women construction workers who worked on that roof, and she was pleased to hear about the diversity initiatives on behalf of the construction crew.

Adjournment:

Upon a motion from Secretary McCord and a second from Mr. Gibbons, the IAC members voted unanimously to conclude the meeting at 10:31 a.m.

Section 5-303(j) of the Education Article of the Maryland Code requires that, for each Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project that receives an allocation of State school-construction funds from the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC), the LEA execute a contract with a vendor within two years of the IAC's approval of the project allocation. On August 20, 2020, Robert A. Gorrell, Executive Director of the IAC — acting pursuant to the Proclamation of Governor Lawrence J. Hogan, Jr. (the "Governor") dated March 5, 2020 proclaiming a State of Emergency related to COVID-19; and the Order of the Governor dated March 12, 2020 — issued a Notice extending the date by which a CIP project must be under contract. The Notice was updated on April 1, 2021 to require that projects extended under the Governor's order be under contract by June 30, 2021, pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order No. 21-03-09-03.

Item 1G. Aging Schools Program: Fiscal Year 2022 LEA Allocations

Motion:

This item is informational and does not require IAC action.

Background

Information:

In compliance with Education Article § 5-206(f)(2) Distribution of Grants – Aging Schools Program, specified funding amounts are allocated to each school system in the State of Maryland to address capital improvements, repairs, maintenance and deferred maintenance work at existing public school buildings and sites serving students.

To date a total of \$6.468M is available to be allocated to eligible projects throughout the State of Maryland. For Fiscal Year 2022, \$6.109 million in State General Obligation Bonds and \$359,395 in unexpended prior year balances are available for distribution. Similar to CIP allocations, ASP balances are to be reserved for the specific LEAs to which they were originally allocated. Since the funding consists of bond proceeds, eligible projects will be required to have at least a 15-year anticipated lifespan.

Project submission requests are reviewed for eligibility on a rolling basis. For this fiscal year, IAC staff will begin soliciting applications beginning on April 30, 2021 and will stop accepting applications on April 4, 2022. All project reimbursement requests are due to the IAC's finance office by December 1, 2022. The Summary of LEA Allocations and administrative procedures are included as backup material.

1. Background

Maryland's Aging Schools Program was established by legislation in 1997. Subsequent legislation extended and modified it. Funds are distributed in accordance with the Education Article §5-206(f)(2). Beginning with fiscal year 2010, funding for the Program was provided from proceeds of State general obligation bonds. Eligible projects were thereafter restricted to those having at least a 15-year anticipated lifespan.

The ASP is administered by the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) in accordance with COMAR 14.39.02 Regulations for the Administration of the Public School Construction Program, .18 Aging Schools Program. The IAC approves expenditures and develops administrative procedures for the Program.

2. Purpose

The Aging Schools Program (ASP) provides State funds to all school systems in the State of Maryland to address the needs of their aging school buildings. These funds may be utilized for capital improvement projects in existing public school buildings and sites serving students. These funds may also be used to fund window air- conditioning units.

3. Allocations

- 1. Funding allocations for each Local Education Authority's (LEA) are set forth in Education Article §5- 206(f)(2).
- 2. By May 1 of each year the IAC staff will disseminate information regarding the annual allocation available for each LEA and the program schedule.
- State funds provided through the ASP do not require matching local funds. The LEA is required to have local funds available for the payment of cost in excess of the State allocation and ineligible project cost.

4. Eligible Aging School Projects

Eligible projects are capital improvements to public school buildings and sites that, when completed, would protect the school building from deterioration, improve the safety of students and staff, and enhance the delivery of educational programs. This listing of eligible items can be found in Attachment I - Eligible Projects\Expenditures and Required Project Approvals.

1. The amount of ASP funding requested must be at least \$10,000 and no more than the total State allocation for the LEA, except as allowed by Section E of this procedures guide, and there are no restrictions on the LEA providing additional funds for the project.



- 2. The building or building system improved by the project must have a minimum calculated age of 16 years at the time the funding request is submitted. Age will be calculated from the following:
 - a) Original occupancy date if never renovated, or;
 - b) Occupancy date following a complete renovation, or;
 - c) Average of original occupancy date and post-partial renovation occupancy date.
- **3.** The school's utilization rate should be at least 60%; however, the LEA may submit documentation for approval justifying the project if the rate is less.

5. Ineligible Projects/Expenditures

Ineligible projects and expenditures are the same as those specified in COMAR 14.39.02.11, Regulations on the Administration of the Public School Construction Program, Ineligible Expenditures. The listing of ineligible expenditures can be found in *COMAR 14.39.02.11*. *Ineligible Expenditures*. Additionally, ASP funds may not be used:

- a) To increase the State or local share of a project;
- b) To supplement an approved State allocation for a project;
- c) For improvements to property owned by a board of education that is not used by public school students:
- d) For a contractual period exceeding one year;
- e) For improvements to or the movement of relocatable classroom buildings;
- f) For the establishment of a contingency account for change orders for any public school construction project.

Projects placed under contract before approval by the IAC are not eligible.

6. Application Process

The LEA shall submit the ASP application to the SharePoint portal for review and final approval by the IAC and preliminary approval by the designees using the ASP Application form located on http://sp1.pscp.state.md.us. Refer to the Appendix II: Instructions for Submission of Aging Schools Program (ASP) Application to the PSCP SharePoint Portal document for specific directions. The Instructions for Submission of ASP is located on the IAC website (Aging Schools Program).

- The project must be of a distinctive type in a single building and within the list of eligible expenditures shown in Attachment I - Eligible Projects/Expenditures and Required Project Approvals.
- 2. The application should list the proposed projects in priority order and include one or two paragraphs describing in detail the existing conditions and the proposed scope of work including the determination of the applicability of the Emergency Shelter Compliance Process. The submission should also include:
 - i. The actual age of the building or building system improved.
 - ii. The number of units or square footage involved, if appropriate.



- iii. A cost estimate for the project.
- iv. The anticipated dates of commencement and completion of the work.
- v. The method by which the work will be accomplished, e.g. competitive bids, existing open- ended contracts, or purchase orders.
- vi. The category identified for design or specification services that will be utilized for the project, e.g. architect, engineer, consultant, staff.
- **3.** For those projects that would qualify as capital maintenance (systemic) projects under the Capital Improvement Program, the same information required for CIP submissions is required for the ASP.
- **4.** The ASP list of projects may be submitted following a date specified by the IAC annually, and must be submitted at least 60 days before the end of the fiscal year for which funding is available.
- 5. After projects are approved and assigned a PSC/ASP number, the LEA may determine that another project is of a higher priority. The LEA may then request a substitution for the previously approved ASP project. The request will be subject to review and approval as for all ASP projects.
- 6. The cumulative cost estimate for the proposed projects may exceed the LEA's allocation by no more than ten (10) percent. The proposed work estimate may be adjusted upon request from the LEA at the time of contract award approval or approval of the purchase order. Funding is limited to the LEA's total annual allocation.

7. Project Approval Process

- 1. Requests from the school systems will be reviewed and processed as they are received. The following will be considered:
 - a) Type of work;
 - **b)** Age of the building or system;
 - c) Current CIP for other work planned at the facility;
 - d) The utilization rate of the school.
- 2. It is anticipated that projects will be approved within ten (10) working days of a complete submission. A PSC/ASP project number will then be assigned. A project can then proceed through the design and/or procurement process.
- 3. Attachment I Eligible Projects\Expenditures and Required Project Approvals lists the levels of review required for eligible expenditures prior to advertising and bidding. The State may alter these requirements at its discretion. Failure to comply with these review requirements will result in the project being deemed ineligible for State funding. The submission requirements for projects that repair or replace components of a building system could be reduced during the initial review process.
- **4.** The LEA will be required to provide an (IAC/PSCP Form 104.2) Environmental Assessment Form (https://iac.mdschoolconstruction.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/12/Environmental-Assessment.doc) to the State Clearinghouse if the project will change the footprint of the existing facility.
- 5. The Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) is to be consulted for each project that the LEA



- determines will be used for public shelter during a national, state, or local emergency event.
- 6. The Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) must be consulted on all projects for State funding, requiring standard review as set forth in the Programmatic Agreement. The LEA should review the MHT Schools by Category list for projects receiving State funding to determine if consultation with MHT is applicable to the requested project. The project review submission form is available at http://www.mht.maryland.gov. Contact Amanda Apple, Maryland Historical Trust at (410) 697-9533 or Amanda.apple@maryland.gov if you have any questions.

8. Procurement/Contract Awards

1. Procurements shall be in compliance with COMAR 14.39.03 Construction Procurement Methods as well as § 5-112 of the Education Article. State ASP funds may only be expended for projects which are placed under contract or procured after a PSC/ASP number is assigned and the project has proceeded through the required review process for the specific project type. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in the withholding of funds for that project. The school system may then substitute another project for review and approval.

The following will apply:

- a) Projects which cost less than \$50,000 do not require IAC approval of the procurement and, generally, sealed bids are not required unless a local board of education policy or procedure has a dollar value that requires sealed bids.
- b) Projects which cost at least \$50,000 but less than \$100,000 are required to be bid, consistent with Section 5-112 Bids of the Education Article. IAC approval of contracts with a total cost of less than \$100,000 is not required prior to entering into the contract but is subject to State review at the time reimbursement is requested. A copy of the bid tabulation must be submitted with IAC/PSCP Form RE 4000 Project Reimbursement/Expenditure Report for the ASP project.
- c) Projects which cost \$100,000 or more are required to be bid, consistent with Section 5-112 Bids of the Education Article. IAC approval of the contract award is required prior to the board of education entering into the contract. A copy of the bid tabulation with a copy of the low bidder's proposal must be submitted for State review and approval of the contract award.
- 2. An existing State or local contract which was previously competitively bid can be utilized for any project in the funding levels described above. The previously approved contract number, the bid date, and the expiration date of the contract should be submitted.
- 3. Projects over \$500,000 in which the State participation is more than 25% of the total contract value, can utilize an existing State or local contract, so long as verification is provided that prevailing wages are paid, in accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article §17-201 through §17-226.
- **4.** The LEA must utilize its MBE procedures for all ASP project procurements. All requests for reimbursement must include a completed *Project Reimbursement/Expenditures Report, Minority Business Enterprise Participation Form* is located on the PSCP website: https://iac.mdschoolconstruction.org/?page_id=2813.



- 5. Adherence to the MBE procedures is required for all ASP project procurements to ensure reimbursement at project completion. Projects with a construction value estimate in excess of \$50,000 are required to submit a MBE Goal Setting Analysis to PSCP, as specified in Subsection 5.d of the amended Section 4.0 MBE Goals Setting Procedures. For projects with a construction value in excess of \$200,000, the Form should also be sent to the Governor's Office of Small, Minority & Women Business Affairs (GOSBA). Any questions regarding MBE submissions should be directed to iac.pscp@maryland.gov.
- 6. A State school construction sign is required for ASP projects costing \$100,000 or more. These signs are available from the Maryland Correctional Enterprises (MCE) Sign Plant #111, C/O Patuxent Institution, Attn: Charles Behnke, Plant Manager, 7555 Waterloo Road, Jessup, MD 20794; their telephone number is (410) 799-5102. They may be ordered by faxing a purchase order to (410) 799-7911. The e-mail address for the Sign Shop is Charles.Behnke@maryland.gov. The Construction Sign mock-up is located on the IAC website https://iac.mdschoolconstruction.org/?page_id=616.

9. Processing For Payment

Payment for work completed under the ASP will be through reimbursement to the school system. The State will provide a single payment to the school system at the completion of the project. Upon completion of the project, the school system should submit IAC/PSCP form RE 4000 *Project Reimbursement/Expenditure Report* (https://iac.mdschoolconstruction.org/?page_id=737) and IAC/PSCP form 306.4 page 3 *Certified Minority Business Enterprise Participation* (https://iac.mdschoolconstruction.org/?page_id=2813). Copies of cancelled checks and contractor's requisitions/invoices or paid purchase orders must accompany this form. If the contractor's requisitions/invoices do not provide a description of the type of work performed, a copy of the purchase order or contract shall be provided. No other financial reports or documentation need be submitted to process the reimbursement request. As with all State-funded school construction projects, supporting documentation must be retained until future audit.

- In lieu of submitting a copy of the cancelled check from the bank, the Contractor's Certification of Receipt of Payment (Attachment VII - IAC/PSCP form 306.2a) will be accepted to initiate reimbursement. It must be signed by the contractor and notarized. This form must accompany IAC/PSCP form RE 4000 - Project Reimbursement/Expenditure Report. Cancelled checks (originals) must be maintained by the LEA for subsequent review by PSCP auditors.
- 2. If the request for reimbursement differs from the amount specified in the initial submission, the school system must submit a brief explanation of the difference and specify the action requested by the school system. All requests for reimbursement shall be submitted 30 days prior to the end of the calendar year in which reimbursement is required.

10. Future Project Funding

1. If a public school building is renovated through the Capital Improvement Program within 15 years of the completion of an ASP project, the maximum State construction allocation for the renovation or limited renovation of the building shall be adjusted to account for the State's previous ASP allocation. Local funds expended for such improvements will not be deducted in future years from the maximum State



construction allocation.

All projects require State review, approval and the assignment of a PSC/ASP number prior to award of contract.

Any project with a total cost of \$100,000 or more requires State approval of the contract award prior to proceeding.

Review level submission requirements are as follows:

- 1) No review required by MSDE or DGS.
- 2) Abbreviated educational specifications, schematic drawings, design development documents/construction documents required for MSDE/DGS review as applicable.
- Design development documents/construction documents required for DGS review.
- 4) Construction documents required for DGS review.

11. Appendix II - Ineligible Expenditures

1. Ineligible Expenditures.

The following expenditures are ineligible for State funding:

- **A.** Site acquisition;
- B. Offsite development costs except those listed as eligible in Regulation .10 of this chapter;
- c. Master plans;
- D. Projects proposed in buildings or portions of buildings that have been constructed or renovated within 15 years, except that a building or portion of a building in which a limited renovation was performed is eligible for additional work within 15 years of the date that the limited renovation construction was completed;
- **E.** Capital Maintenance projects to replace, upgrade, or renovate building systems that have been replaced, upgraded, or renovated within 15 years.
- F. Ancillary construction costs such as:
 - (1) Permits;
 - (2) Bid advertising;
 - (3) Water and sewer connection charges;
 - (4) Models; or
 - (5) Renderings;
- G. Leasing school facilities except as provided in COMAR 14.39.05;
- H. Construction inspection services;
- **I.** Relocation costs for site occupants:
- J. Salaries of local employees;
- **K.** Construction of administrative or support facilities, including regional or central administrative offices, warehousing, resource, printing, vehicle storage, and maintenance facilities;
- L. Movable equipment, furnishings, and artwork as defined by the IAC;
- **M.** Temporary storage.

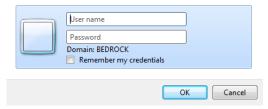
In any case, where a local board desires to proceed with a capital improvement project, or part thereof, which is ineligible for State funding, the Commission shall determine the added cost to the approved project generated by the ineligible aspects, and the local board may proceed with the project but without State funding for the added cost.



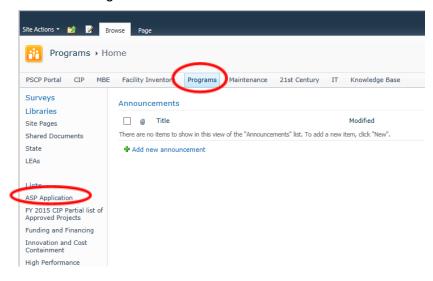

- **17.** If an application has been submitted in error, please notify IAC staff at iac.pscp@maryland.gov and the request will be deleted; "Cancelled" status indicates the project was previously "Approved" then later "Cancelled".

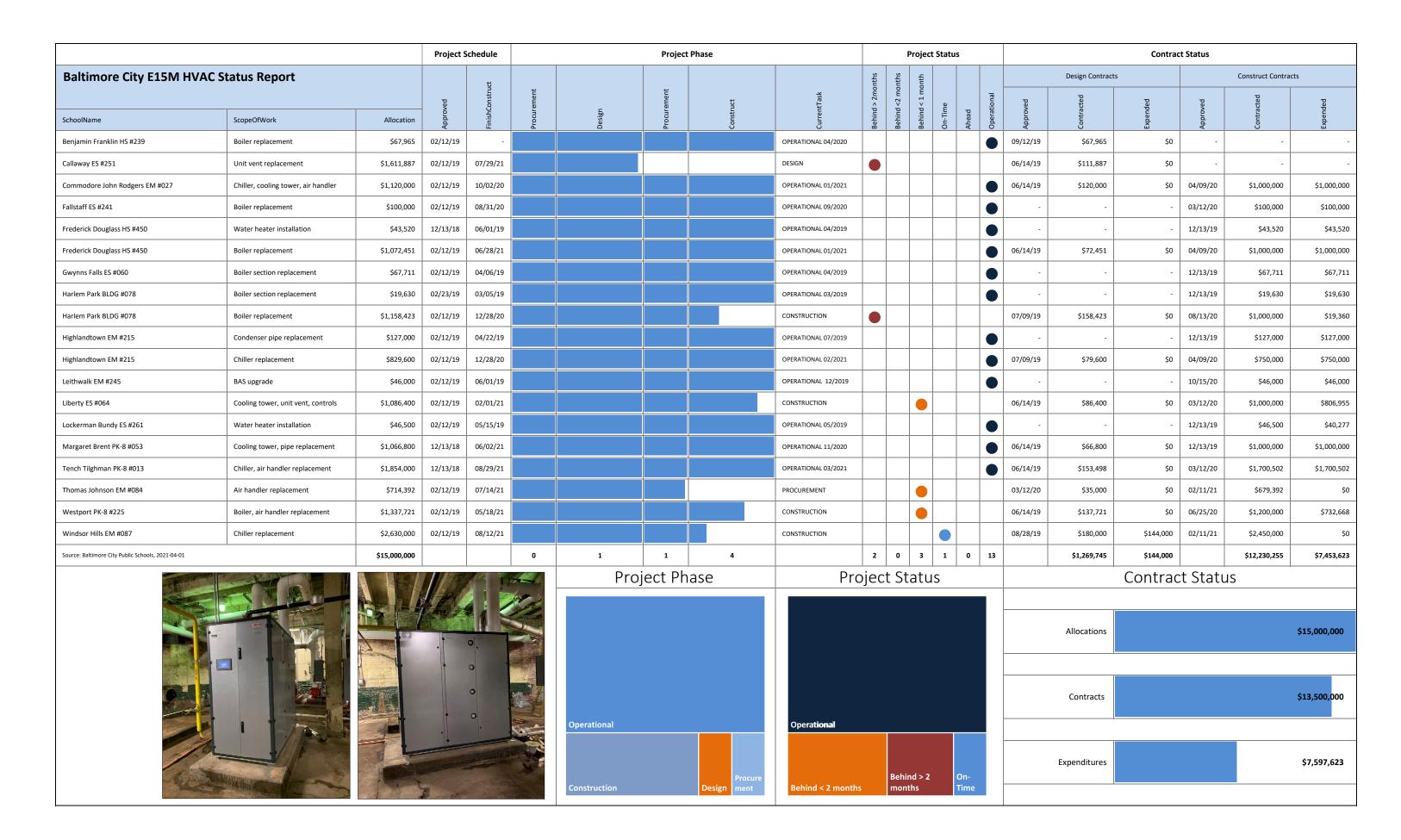

To approve the transfer of the dedicated use of eight (8) Baltimore City Public Schools buildings as listed, from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in accordance with the *Annual Review of Schools: 2020-2021 Recommendations,* approved by the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners on January 12, 2021 and in accordance with the *Memorandum of Understanding for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools* dated December, 2016; with the agreement that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall reimburse the state the total outstanding bond debt service in the amount of \$1,037,232.45 by the scheduled dates provided by the State Treasurer's Office. The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall obtain approval of the Interagency Commission on School Construction before transferring any right, title, or interest to any portion of the property.

Background Information and Building Details

Per the letter March 15, 2021 (see attached), Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) has requested approval of the transfer of eight properties (see Table 1 below) from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. While most would support the implementation of the 21st Century Schools Building Program in particular, all of the requested transfers would make the City Schools portfolio more affordable.

The surplus of the eight buildings, with a median age of 44 years would reduce the total size of the City Schools portfolio by 452,674 gross square feet (gsf), and reduce the annual cost to operate and maintain the City Schools portfolio by an estimated \$7.2 million.

Upon IAC approval, City Schools will transfer ownership of the eight buildings to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. The Mayor and City Council would be required to reimburse the state for the total outstanding bond debt service on the buildings, and to seek IAC approval before subsequent transfers.

IAC staff recommend approval of the presented eight property transfers in Baltimore City.

To approve the use by the Montgomery County Board of Education (MCBOE) of 30.68 acres at 9400 Fields Road, Gaithersburg, MD, 20878, on the tract known as Lot 1, Block GG, Crown Farm, for the construction of a Crown High School, with a scheduled opening in August 2026; adhering to the actions identified in the state clearinghouse review, state identifier MD20210128-0051.

Background:

The Montgomery County Board of Education (MCBOE) requests site approval for the Crown High School site, located at 9400 Fields Road in Gaithersburg.

The property is currently owned by the City of Gaithersburg and will be dedicated, at no cost, to the Montgomery County Board of Education for the use of a public high school, per an annexation agreement between the developer and the City of Gaithersburg, recorded at the Land Records of Montgomery County, dated December 7, 2010.

On December 7, 2010, by way of Second Amendment to Annexation Agreement X-182, recorded among the Land Records (I/f 40686/236), a developer agreed to donate to the City of Gaithersburg a parcel of land from the Crown Village Property, containing no more than 32.1 acres, for the use and construction of a public high school by Montgomery County Public Schools. On June 26, 2019, VII Crown Farm Owner, LLC conveyed the approximately 30.68-acre future school site parcel to the City of Gaithersburg.

When the state approval process is complete, a deed from the City of Gaithersburg will be recorded at the Land Records of Montgomery County. The new school project has been identified in the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Capital Budget and the FY 2021–2026 Capital Improvements Program for completion by August 2026.

The site was one of three evaluated. The estimated cost of construction is \$136.2 million. The school has a proposed capacity of 2,700 students in grades 9-12 and will serve the mid-county region of Montgomery County.

The Montgomery County Board of Education approved the site on July 18, 2006. State Clearinghouse review was completed in March 2021.

Land Use and Infrastructure

- The site is in the County's PFA.
- Current zoning is MXD, Mixed Use Development. Crown Farm is currently a developing, mixed use, transit-focused neighborhood. Public institutional use is permitted within the zone.
- Public water, sewer, natural gas and electric service are available within the existing development.
- The site is in a planned residential neighborhood currently under construction. Existing commercial uses exist to the north, south, and east of the site.
- The site is surrounded on three sides by MCDOT-maintained roadways.

• The nearest fire station is 2.2 miles away.

Environmental and Natural Settings

- The southern portion of the site is located within a 100-year floodplain. Construction near the floodplain, if it occurs, would be limited to storm drain outfall only.
- There are no tidal or non-tidal wetlands on the site.
- The site was previously used as agricultural land.
- No known rare, threatened or endangered species of plant or animals or habitats are known to exist on or near the site.
- There is significant drainage to the unnamed tributary on site. The remainder of off-site drainage is limited to adjacent street runoff.
- A Storm Drain Easement, Forest Conservation Easement, P.U.E., Fire Hydrant Easement, and a PEPCO Easement will be required to complete construction.

Item 2.C. Approval of Property Transfer – Anne Arundel County – Severn Intergenerational Center (Reece Road site)

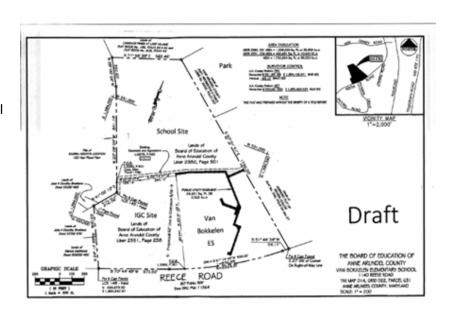

The Anne Arundel County Board of Education (AACBOE) seeks approval from the Interagency Commission for School Construction to transfer 10.6 acres of land to the Anne **Arundel County** government for the development of the Severn Intergenerational Center. The 27,000square foot center would include a 13,500-square foot

senior center.



Under the terms of an agreement between the AACBOE and the county government dated October 30, 2020, the Board of Education would transfer the unimproved parcel, which the Board of Education acquired in 1972, and retain 28.9 acres that contains Van Bokkelen Elementary School, just to the east, and a future school site directly behind the proposed center and existing school.

The agreement includes access and pedestrian easements to allow the Board of Education to access the property and facilitate future utility improvements.

As part of the agreement, the County will develop a future shared use agreement with the Board of Education enabling the BOE use of the 15.67-acre Meade Village Park site, at 1760 Meade Village Circle, for future athletic, recreational and park activities at Van Bokkelen Elementary School and the future school site. This park property was improved with Maryland DNR Program Open Space funds and is behind and adjacent to the future school site.

An unoccupied existing home on the undeveloped site acquired by the Board of Education will be demolished. The parties will work together to execute the needed documents and fulfill local requirements should State approval of this proposed action be granted.

Item 2.D. Approval of Property Change/Transfer – Dorchester County – Hurlock Elementary School Ballfields

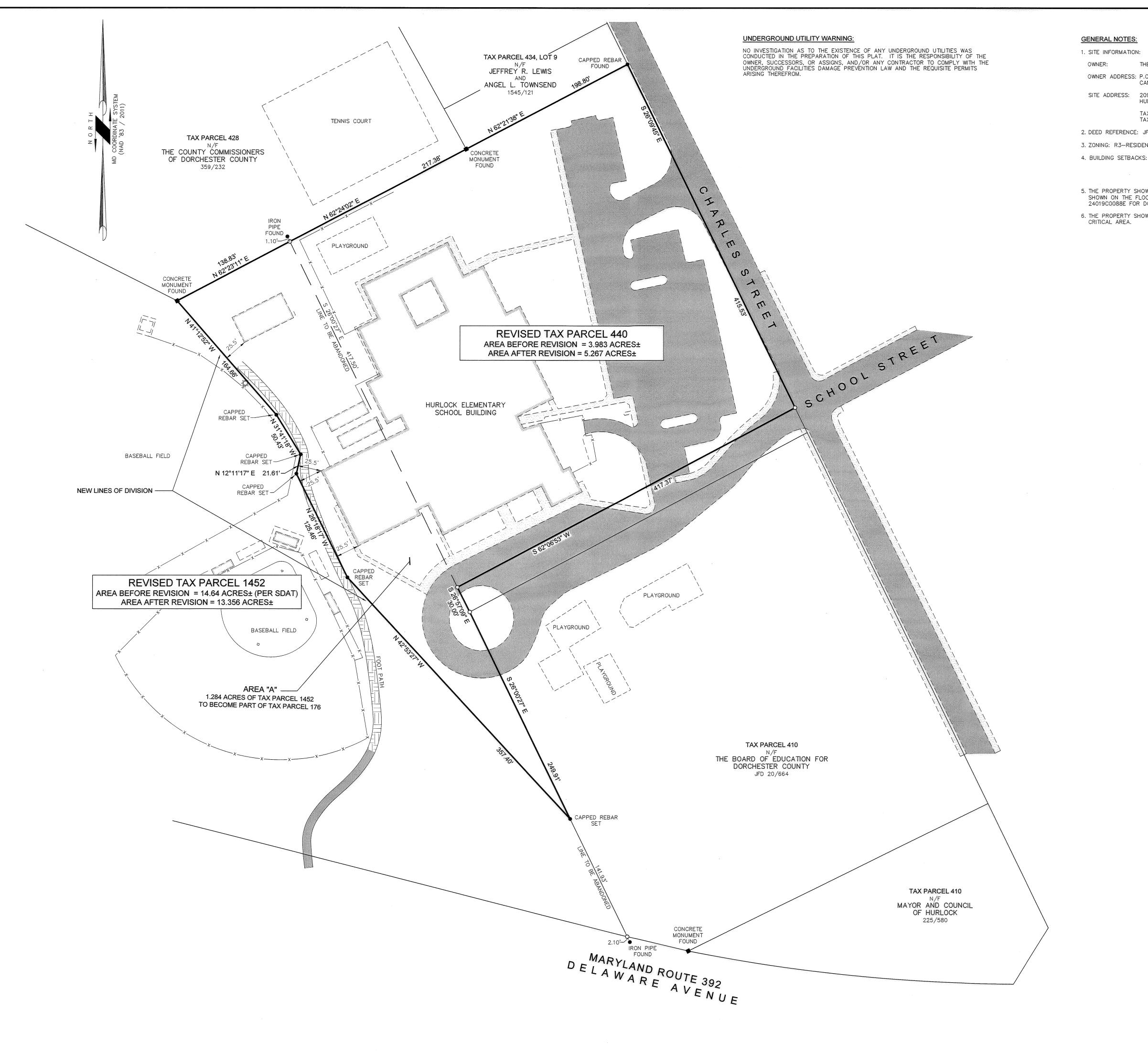

Background Information:

The Board of Education of Dorchester County seeks approval from the Interagency Commission on School Construction to make a minor modification of parcel boundaries in coordination with the Dorchester County Government, so that all of the recreational uses behind Hurlock Elementary School, at 301 Charles Street in Hurlock, are on county-owned property.

Under the revision, the school would occupy Tax Parcel 440, controlled by the Board of Education, thus reducing its size from 5.267 to 3.963 acres, and the ballfield and concession stand would occupy Tax Parcel 1452, owned by Dorchester County, which would increase in size from 13.356 to 14.64 acres. The change is being made to expand Tax Parcel 1452 to include the concession stand.

The change is being made to clarify the liabilities assumed by the Board of Education, for the school facilities, and the Parks and Recreation for the recreational facilities.

Item 3. FY 2023 Cost per Square Foot for School Construction

Motion:

To adopt the FY 2023 Statewide per-square-foot school building costs of \$353 per sf for building only.

Background Information:

COMAR 14.39.02.06F requires the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) to establish the average Statewide per-square-foot school building cost that will apply to the capital improvement program by July of the calendar year in which applications are submitted. The calculation should be based on bids received for new school construction in the prior year and cost information derived from industry sources. The adopted figure may be adjusted by the IAC to reflect market conditions before approval of the final State CIP.

Based upon recent school construction bids and a review of national building cost indexes, IAC staff recommends that the IAC increase the cost per sf figure to be used for the FY 2023 CIP to \$353 per sf for building only.

This is a 3.5% increase over the FY 2022 cost per sf figures of \$341 for building only. Please note that site costs and design costs are in addition to this building only figure. However, the gross amount due to each LEA does not change.

Item 4. Carroll County - Westminster East Middle School Replacement - Gross Area Baseline Variance

Motion:

To approve a gross area baseline (GAB) variance that will support an additional 2,740 gross square feet (GSF) for the Westminster East Middle School (PSC 06.004) replacement project, increasing the gross area eligible for state support from 99,278 GSF to 102,018 GSF (inclusive of cooperative use space) for a justifiable planning enrollment of 671 students, consistent with the provisions of COMAR 14.39.02.06E.

Background:

At the May 9, 2019 meeting of the IAC, the Commission adopted revised Gross Area Baselines (GABs) for the determination of the gross square footage eligible for state support in capital school construction projects. In contrast to the Maximum Gross Area Allowances, the GABs "enable an IAC variance process by which the IAC may grant additional square footage allowances on a case-by-case basis upon an LEA's request and presentation of sufficient data supporting the need for additional square footage."

In a letter dated February 24, 2021, Carroll County Public Schools (CCPS) requested that the IAC support an additional 12,500 GSF above the GAB for the Westminster East Middle School replacement project to support two countywide special-education programs to be co-located in this replacement school project. These programs require a self-contained suite to provide additional resources necessary for meeting requirements in students' Individual Education Plans (IEPs), while the co-location of the programs with Westminster East Middle School will allow the special-education students to be included in a general education environment when appropriate in order to provide the least restrictive environment (LRE) for each student. Upon receipt of the letter and attachments, staff reviewed the request.

Based upon review of all program considerations in coordination with CCPS staff on March 12, 2021, the following was determined:

- CCPS's GAB variance request of 12,500 GSF for the special-education suite could not be considered because the GAB for the entire school already provided 180 GSF per special-education student — or 9,000 total GSF — for the 50 special-education students that the suite will serve.
- 2. In order to avoid double-counting the 50 special-education students for GSF calculation purposes, the IAC evaluated CCPS's request as being for an additional 70 GSF per special-education student or 3,500 total GSF for the special-education suite;
- 3. A thorough review with CCPS staff of detailed floor plans, inclusive of furniture layouts and space-utilization data revealed that an additional 54.8 GSF per special-education student or 2,740 total GSF beyond the 9,000 GAB GSF could reasonably meet the need for additional space to deliver the IEP-required programs and services for the 50 students in the self-contained special-education suite.

As a result, staff recommend that a GAB variance of an additional 54.8 GSF per special-education student — or 2,740 total GSF — to provide the space needed for the self-contained special-education suite. The resulting GAB eligible for State participation would be adjusted

up to an estimated 102,018 GSF from the current estimated 99,278 SF (inclusive of

cooperative-use space).

Dear Mr. Gorrell,

The purpose of this letter is to request a waiver of 12,500 gross square feet above the Gross Area Baseline (GAB) square footage for this project due to the fact that this project includes two co-located Special Education programs. The East Middle replacement school will house the countywide Behavior Educational Support Team (BEST) and the Intensive Behavior Intervention (IBI) programs that serve students from the entire county. The design of the replacement school has both programs being housed in a self-contained suite that contains several resources required as part these students' Individualized Education Programs (IEP's). The co-location of these programs at East Middle School provides these students the ability to be mainstreamed into a regular education environment as their IEP allows. This provides a continuum of programs and services for these students to meet the goal of providing the least restrictive environment for each student.

This additional 12,500 square feet will provide the capacity to serve up to 45 BEST students (15 per grade) and 5 IBI students. The BEST program is designed to meet the needs of students whose disability impacts Social/Emotional/Behavioral functioning to a degree that requires resources beyond what is available in their home school. This program provides a supportive and positive environment where expectations are clearly defined and consistencies in behavior management techniques are practiced. The IBI classroom provides a space for students who are re-integrating to a school environment from a psychiatric hospitalization.

The proposed replacement school (excluding the BEST and IBI suite) is intended serve the same population that the current school serves (750 local capacity). The 750 local capacity is based on 10 core academic classrooms per grade level (6th-8th). This local capacity formula accounts for the middle school instructional model that Carroll County Public Schools utilizes. This local formula accounts for the fact that students in a middle school are scheduled as a block and not individually.

This project does also include the addition of a special education classroom to serve the Learning for Independence (LFI) students living within East Middle's attendance boundary. The current LFI students that live within the East Middle School boundary have been attending West Middle School due to the inability of East Middle to accommodate the program. East Middle school is the only middle school in the county that does not have an LFI classroom to serve this population. This project will provide an LFI classroom for these special education students in their geographic home school.

The local design capacity of 810 (including BEST, IBI, and LFI) is supported by the enrollment projections for East Middle School. These projections indicate that East Middle will have 792 students in the 2027-28 school year. Although the local design capacity is supported by the enrollment projections, the State justified enrollment for this project is only 671 students. This justified enrollment number is derived by looking at the adjacent schools' enrollment projections compared to their State Rated Capacities (SRC) to determine if there is room to redistrict East Middle students. The SRC formula for secondary schools does not differentiate between the ways a high school is scheduled versus a middle school. As a result, the utilization for West Middle based on the SRC is lower than our local utilization calculation. Based on our Board of Education's local middle school capacity, the projected utilization of West Middle School in 2027-28 is 96%. This would equate to a total of only 41 seats available in West Middle compared to the 121 available seats based on the SRC formula.

Based on the replacement school serving 760 students in its geographic attendance area, the GAB for this portion of the building would be 108,500 square feet. If you add the 12,500 square feet for the BEST/IBI suite, then the total GAB for the school would be 121,000 square feet. The current design of the replacement school is 126,000 square feet. Staff has worked throughout the design process to make the building serve the needs of the school as efficiently as possible. We feel strongly that the current design is an efficient middle school building that meets the needs of the students in this community. Throughout the design process we have provided program information, utilization spreadsheets, and furniture layouts to both Jillian Storms and Jamie Bridges to illustrate the efficiency of this building.

Based on discussions with the IAC Project Manager assigned to Baltimore City Schools, Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) is formally requesting that the funding for the Capital Improvement projects noted below be rescinded.

For each project below we have provided a justification as to why the project is being rescinded. We appreciate your consideration for our request.

City Schools requests rescission of the following projects. The total rescinded state CIP funds for the below projects is \$2,467,000.00.

- 1. #011 Eutaw Marshburn Elementary AC PSC #30.267.20 SR \$ 1,254,000
 - a. Justification: Upon designing the project, it was determined that there is a failure occurring in the exterior skin of the building. The VPU's would need to attach to that system, as well as integrate with the window project. Including the exterior skin replacement in the project increases the overall project estimate to approximately \$10M. This is not a health and safety concern at this time, and other projects are of higher priority for using the district reserve contingency funds. The scope and budget will be revised to incorporate the replacement of the building skin, and this project will be reprioritized and submitted as a future CIP project.
- 2. ##011 Eutaw Marshburn Elementary Windows/Doors PSC #30.267.20 SR \$1,213,000
 - a. Justification: Upon designing the project, it was determined that there is a failure occurring in the exterior skin of the building. The new windows would need to attach to that system, as well as integrate with the VPU project. Including the exterior skin replacement in the project increases the overall project estimate to approximately \$10M. This is not a health and safety concern at this time, and other projects are of higher priority for using the district reserve contingency funds. The scope and budget will be revised to incorporate the replacement of the building skin, and this project will be reprioritized and submitted as a future CIP project.

The Maryland Stadium Authority has assumed the lead in producing the report. The Maryland Stadium Authority, Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools), the City of Baltimore (City), and the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) will then present this annual program progress report to the Board of Public Works and the Maryland State Legislature on work related to the 21st Century School Buildings Program once approved.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2020, progress on the execution of the 21st Century School Buildings Program (Program) continued in a successful manner. The Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) and Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) are jointly responsible for the effective delivery of this complex program.

The original goal of the Program was to deliver a projected 23-28 replacement and/or renovated schools by 2020. Due to efficient project management and financial transactions on the bond issuances, we now forecast that this program will deliver 28 school buildings. The program remains on schedule to be substantially complete in 2021, with a few buildings carrying out into 2022/2023 due to swing space conflicts.

It is important to note that four of the new or substantially renovated school buildings contain more than one school. Therefore, while the Program will deliver 28 new or renovated school buildings, the buildings will house 32 schools. Concurrent with this mission is the planned reduction by City Schools of 26 school facilities from the inventory in order to right-size the portfolio, thereby increasing District-wide utilization by the end of the program.

Currently, 17 school buildings housing 19 schools have been completed, with seven under construction, three in design, and one finalizing the feasibility study phase. Regarding local hiring, 948 positions in Baltimore City have been filled with local candidates to date – exceeding the 369-position commitment originally anticipated from our contracts. From a procurement perspective, a total of \$1.06 billion has been contracted to date, with \$352 million of MBE contracts equating to 33.1 percent MBE participation.

As previously reported, MSA implemented an Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP) encompassing 17 of the 28 projects. Based on verified contractor credits, the OCIP has currently achieved savings of \$4.3 million, as well as a greater pool of trade contractors and safer project sites.

Additionally, as a result of efficient project management and recent bond issuance transactions, the MSA is forecasting that there will be an additional \$60 million available for future school funding.

We anticipate that capacity will be available in FY21 to undertake additional work at our current staffing level. Our Program will begin downsizing in FY22 if additional projects are not assigned.

INTRODUCTION

The Maryland Stadium Authority, Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools), the City of Baltimore (City), and the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) present this annual program progress report to the Board of Public Works and the Maryland State Legislature on work related to the 21st Century School Buildings Program, in accordance with the Baltimore City Public Schools Construction and Revitalization Act of 2013.

PROGRAM UPDATE

This section provides a summary of the progress of projects, enrollment projections, and annual portfolio planning requirements for the 21st Century School Buildings Program.

Plan Year 1 Schools: Progress Update

Plan Year 1 projects progressed significantly during 2020. As of the time of this report, two schools opened in the summer of 2017, two opened in the spring of 2018, five opened in the summer of 2018, one opened in the summer of 2019, and the final project is nearing the completion of construction.

Plan Year 2 Schools: Progress Update

The 17 proposed Plan Year 2 projects include one PK-2 school, one grade 3-8 school, seven PK-5 schools, seven PK-8 schools, and one high school program, as shown in Table 2. Additionally, one PK-8 and one PK-5 special education program will be co-located at two of the 17 buildings. Plan Year 2 projects progressed significantly during 2020. As of the time of this report, one school opened in the summer of 2020 and two schools reached substantial completion in December 2020. The order of Plan Year 2 Schools, originally established in 2014, was changed to respond to changing school enrollments and facility conditions as well as uncertain market conditions. Current schedules are provided in **Exhibit 2.**

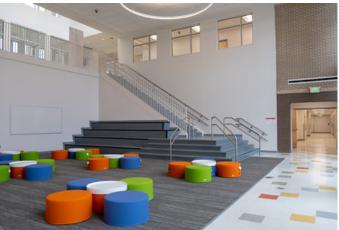

Harford Heights Building - This 144,290 sq. ft. replacement school project will co-locate two school programs, Harford Heights Elementary, a traditional PK-5 school and Sharp-Leadenhall, a separate PK-5 public day school program. Sharp-Leadenhall students will remain in their current school building until the new building is completed. Construction started in April 2020 and is scheduled to be complete in summer 2021.

Northwood Elementary School (PK-5) – This 100,213 sq. ft. replacement project was necessitated by enrollment growth in Northeast Baltimore. Students will remain on site during construction. Construction started in July 2020 with the new building (the first of two phases) scheduled to be complete in December 2021.

Montebello Elementary/Middle School (PK-8) – This 93,876 sq. ft. renovation with addition project, necessitated by enrollment considerations in Northeast Baltimore, is in GMP negotiation. Students are currently in temporary swing space at the Professional Development Center Building. The project will start construction in February 2021 is scheduled to open for students in summer of 2022.

Highlandtown #237 Elementary/Middle School (PK-8) – This project was initially an addition only project necessitated by enrollment growth in Southeast Baltimore but was expanded in December 2020 to include both a 48,266 sq. ft. building addition and a limited renovation of 74,492 sq. ft. of the existing building. The project is currently in the Design Phase. Design is anticipated to be complete in spring 2020. Students are located in temporary swing space at the Southeast Middle Building. The school will open for students in August 2022.

SWING SPACE

During 2020, the program prepared three (3) Year 2 schools to relocate from their swing space into their newly completed permanent school buildings. Mary E Rodman was relocated during summer, and the two (2) others -- Medfield, and Walter P. Carter were relocated during the winter break.

The program also prepared two (2) Year 2 schools to relocate to swing spaces to facilitate renovation on their buildings. Highlandtown #237 was moved to the Southeast Middle Building, and Montebello into the Professional Development Center (PDC) Building, both during summer. Despite working under the disruption of COVID-19, the team demonstrated flexibility with its move logistics in terms of coordinating construction, furniture installation, and relocation within the original schedules.

The effort continues to require significant and logistics planning, project management focus, and the facilitation of transition services for each school. See **Exhibit 8** and refer to the Public Relation section for more detail.

21ST CENTURY ACADEMIC PLANNING

Baltimore City Public Schools has developed an academic planning process to support its schools with creating inspiring education environments. 21st Century Schools continues to collaborate with the broader school community to re-imagine the educational experience in the new environments.

The 21st Century Academic Planning Process involves working with the school-based instructional leadership team to address three key components of the plan. The first component is to identify an academic focus area based on shared educational values and the unique culture of the school community. Within the academic focus area, the leadership team considers how to address literacy and needs of the whole child and its families. Next, the leadership team revisits school structures to adjust processes and procedures to ensure a safe and supportive school environment. Third, the school considers current school traditions, how these traditions can be enhanced using the newly identified academic focus, and which traditions the school may want to add as it continues to grow in the new learning environment.

Nine months prior to the opening of a new 21st Century School, the academic planning process begins. Input and feedback are garnered from staff, students, parents, community members, and partners throughout this process through Instructional Leadership Meetings, School Family Council Meetings, Parent & Community Meetings, and Student Focus Groups. All stakeholders are involved throughout the planning and implementation process and have opportunities to lead this work within and across their stakeholder groups.

The academic focus areas that have been fully identified as of December 2020 are indicated in Table 3 below.

Professional Learning opportunities are provided for 21st Century Schools to enhance the implementation of their academic focus and to support the utilization of instructional technology to teach the 21st century skills of collaboration, communication, critical thinking, and creativity. Professional learning opportunities for this year included the following:

- Job-embedded learning opportunities led by arts educators to support arts integration at Bay-Brook in the spring of 2020.
- Achievement Unit courses focused on instructional technology best practices offered in the spring, summer, and fall of 2020 for instructional staff in 21st Century Schools. These courses focused on digital portfolios and projects, differentiating instruction with technology, blended learning, learner profiles, and creating spaces for 21st Century learning.
- The 21st Century EdTech Institute was held in August 2020 for instructional staff from the five 21st Century Schools opening in the 2020-21 school year, as well as the 21st Century Schools that have

opened in prior years. The Institute was held online August 17th through August 20th and it allowed participants to choose sessions around instructional technology practices that supported the implementation of the 21st century skills of communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity in their classrooms.

- Guided opportunities and specific professional learning sessions around STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math) instruction were provided for Medfield Elementary, and Walter P. Carter Elementary/Middle School in the summer of 2020.
- 3D printer training was provided to two representatives from each of the schools opening this year. At the end of the training each school received two 3D printers as well as filament to support printing student projects.

Ten-Year Enrollment Projections

A major component of the 21st Century School Buildings Program is to help the District reach the target utilization rate for the District. While design capacities incorporate multiple layers of data, a large part of the determination of future capacities is enrollment projections.

Consistent with previous years, City Schools employed a grade progression ratio (GPR) methodology to develop enrollment projections. GPR (also known as "cohort survival") is a standard measure in demographic analysis and is used by school districts nationwide. For grades 1 to 8, a 12-year rolling average GPR was used; for grades 9 to 12, a six-year rolling average was used. We believe this not only helps capture recent trends in student mobility but helps smooth the variations within the projected calculations. Projected enrollment for Kindergarten differs since there are no prior years that can be built on to develop a GPR (Pre-Kindergarten has limited seating and is therefore not an accurate measure of the number of children who will matriculate on to Kindergarten).

Projected enrollment for Kindergarten is calculated using three factors:

- 1) a projection of the Baltimore City population
- 2) a projection of the Birth Rate (per 1,000 people)
- 3) a projection of the "capture rate," the ratio of kindergarten enrollments to city births

To establish a floor around recent decreasing birth counts, our calculations utilize projected birth counts that are calculated by utilizing a five-year rolling average of historical birth rates with the city population projections. Projected captures rates are based on a five-year rolling average as well.

PK enrollments at the program level are dictated by the number of dedicated PK classrooms at the school. Therefore, PK enrollment projections are based on the planned number of classrooms and the historic utilization of the PK classroom space.

Projections for individual schools are adjusted so that the sum of all schools, by grade, matches the District-level projections discussed above. Projections for each grade are aggregated to produce a District total, and then used to calculate the proportion of this aggregated total that a particular grade at a particular school represents.

The final projections model was adjusted to account for several sets of special circumstances including schools adding grades, recruitment efforts, time spent in swing space, schools planned to close, and planned reconfigurations under the 21st Century School Buildings Program.

It is important to note that enrollment projections are coupled with other data points to inform facility capacity decisions. Over the past few years, City Schools has discussed and the IAC/MDP has

acknowledged that 10-year enrollment projections of students in City Schools should be reviewed with other relevant data.

As City Schools has previously experienced a three-year enrollment decline between SY 2015-16 and SY2018-19, the District 10-year enrollment projections reflect that downward District trend across all schools. Beyond the third year of enrollment projections, subsequent years are essentially projections based on the three-year enrollment trend, assuming and projecting ongoing school-level declines due to past District declines.

As such, enrollment projections and projected utilizations should be used as an estimation, but the circumstances at individual schools, as well as other neighborhood information and program data, all available throughout the CEFMP, should be considered when reviewing enrollment projections. This information includes population, demographic, and housing market information available in Chapter 2 and Appendix D of the CEFMP.

Baltimore City Public Schools produces ten-year enrollment projections annually using the current (September 30th) enrollment. SY 2019-20 (September 30, 2019) enrollment was used to generate projections for SY 2020-21 through SY 2029-30.

Based on the MOU, City Schools committed to a final district-wide utilization rate (without swing space) of 86 percent in SY 2019-20. The district exceeded the 86 percent target utilization rate in SY 2019-20, with a District-wide utilization of 87 percent.

The official enrollment for SY 2020-21 is 77,856, a decrease of 2 percent from SY 2019-20. Schools across the state and nation have seen steep declines in early learning enrollment tied to the pandemic/online learning. We anticipate a rebound in early learning enrollment once in-person learning returns. The anticipated SY 2021-22 utilization based on official enrollment for September 30, 2021 is 86 percent*. The anticipated utilization at the end of the 21st Century Program in SY 2024-25 per current Board approved decisions is 82 percent*.

Surplus Buildings

On November 10, 2020, City Schools presented the SY2021 Annual Review recommendations to the School Board of Commissioners. The final vote to approve the surplus of the following buildings will occur in January 2021.

Buildings proposed for surplus June 2021:

- Harriet Tubman Building (currently swing)
- William C. March Building (currently swing)
- Alexander Hamilton Elementary
- Guilford Elementary/Middle
- Sharp-Leadenhall Elementary
- Lois T. Murray Elementary/Middle
- Lockerman Bundy Elementary
- Buildings proposed for surplus June 2022
- West Baltimore Building (currently swing)

Through the Annual Review Process City Schools will continue to pursue opportunities to efficiently utilize facilities. This may include, but is not limited to closing, reconfiguring, and/or consolidating programs.

An additional change presented during the November 10th Board meeting included the extension of the surplus date to 2025 for the Northwestern Building. This change will support the longer time frame that Cross Country needs the facility for swing, and also to accommodate any swing needs arising from the High School Plan under the Built to Learn Act. The list of surplus school facilities can be found in Exhibit 6.

Annual Review of Schools Recommendations and 21st Century School Buildings Program (Formerly Ten-Year Plan) Amendments

City Schools reviews and modifies the plan yearly to reflect any necessary updates as part of its annual portfolio review process now called Annual Review of Schools (Annual Review). These changes and any updates to the 21st Century Schools Buildings Program are then reflected in the CEFMP. The Annual Review includes recommendations beyond amendments to the 21st Century School Buildings Program to include any major changes to schools including relocation, grade configuration changes, combining school communities and/or closure. In 2020, the following factors are considered when reviewing the District's school programs and facilities:

- Academic performance
- Climate indicators
- Access, quality, and distribution of school programming and assessing whether specific student populations and specific geographic areas are equitably served
- · School enrollment and school size
- Building utilization and condition
- Schools scheduled for actions per the 21st Century School Buildings Program

Additionally, the District has worked to make sure that these factors are viewed through an equity lens to understand how each of these show up and impact different communities, and to ensure as a District we are increasing access and improving educational programs, particularly in communities that have been underserved. Also, vital to this process is a shift from bringing in community input in reaction to recommendations, to incorporating school community feedback earlier in the process, where possible, to inform recommendations before presenting to the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners (BOSC). These recommendations are complex and multifaceted affecting families across school communities and much of the work is in reimagining and deepening academic programming in school communities. The table below shows the Annual Review Recommendations and any proposed amendments to the 21st Century School Buildings Program. These were shared at the November 10, 2020 meeting of the BOSC and were approved at the January 12, 2021 BOSC meeting.

District-wide Utilization Plan

As a requirement of the 21st Century School Buildings Program's MOU, City Schools worked jointly with the IAC to develop intermediate and final utilization rate targets. The targets allow the District and MOU partners to track the District's progress toward achieving its utilization goal through new construction and subsequent building closures and surplusing. As the District reduces its building footprint to better reflect current enrollment, the overall utilization rate will increase.

The utilization targets, without swing space, presented below were established and approved by the School Board on December 17, 2013, through a resolution and approved by the IAC on February 20, 2014. Utilization targets with swing space were established and approved by the School Board on January 12, 2016.

- The intermediate District-wide utilization rate target, without swing space, was set at 80 percent for school year 2015-2016. City Schools exceeded this target with a utilization rate of 83 percent in that year.
- The final District-wide utilization rate was set at 86 percent for SY 2019-20, and due to significant changes in student enrollment and changes in the program schedule, identifying substantial completion in 2021, the District is not currently on pace to meet this target.

Regarding the impact of enrollment changes on meeting District utilization targets, it is important to note that in SY 2013-14, the first year the Utilization Report was produced, the projected utilizations indicated the District would meet these targets. As an example, the July 2014 CEFMP utilization projection (without swing space) for SY 2020-21 was 87 percent and for the July 2018 CEFMP that same year is 79 percent. Recent enrollment trends impacting District utilization are driven by a number of external factors such as parents' preferences for various academic settings as well as births. The number of births in Baltimore City has decreased approximately 11 percent from 2009 to 2015. While residential mobility is a potential factor impacting enrollment trends, based on the Non-Public School Report published by MSDE, the number of students living in Baltimore City and not attending City Schools in 2017 was 12,939, relatively the same as the five-year average of 12,547.

District-wide utilization challenges are also largely driven by specific building types and several large buildings in the portfolio. Elementary/PK-8 buildings are overall 99 percent utilized. Excess seats in underutilized buildings are concentrated in middle/high and high school buildings. In fact, most of our excess seats are in buildings that will be:

- 1) addressed by 21st Century School Buildings Program or will be surplused (Lake Clifton, Forest Park, Patterson High School)
- 2) buildings with CTE or arts performance spaces that also count as instructional spaces included in the buildings' State Rated Capacity (SRC) (Edmondson/Westside Skill Center, Dunbar High School, Carver Vocational-Technical High School, Merganthaler Vocational-Technical High School, Baltimore School for the Arts)
- 3) buildings that are housing charters with enrollment caps (Lemmel Building), or
- 4) large buildings where a portion of the building is being used for other purposes (Professional Development Building).

Nearly 60 percent of the excess seats in middle/high and high school buildings are in the 10 buildings mentioned above. City Schools will continue to review its District footprint every year as part of the Annual Portfolio Review. Proposed changes by the Interagency Commission on how CTE and performance spaces are calculated in the SRC methodology.

In addition to the projected utilization rates, the program schedule currently identifies overall substantial completion in 2022. With regard to the program schedule, initially using a range of 23 to 28 schools for completion, acknowledged a measure of uncertainty earlier in the program with respect to the bond market and the dollars that would be needed to complete the renovation and/or replacement of each school as identified in its feasibility study. Certain feasibility studies were delayed, allowing other more critical schools that were necessary to relieve overcrowding and/or accommodate combined schools resulting from portfolio actions to rise in priority. As a result of these factors, the District will request the partners to revisit the utilization targets and revise the School Board resolution.

In review of Exhibit 1 – Summary of Tables, the square footage per student for Year 1 schools is high with some low utilizations due to programs moved into swing spaces. All Year 1 schools, with the exception of Patterson and Arundel, had programs in swing space. When students move to swing space buildings, the buildings tend to be in adjacent neighborhoods or different parts of the city, causing the program to lose enrollment. Therefore, the drop in the enrollment may not reflect the District trend but does reflect the impact of the school program temporarily moving out of the neighborhood.

In review of Year 1 schools, the change in enrollment after school programs move to swing space buildings vary from a 9 percent increase to a 37 percent decrease in enrollment, with the average change of 9 percent decrease in enrollment. Drastic drops in enrollment due to program movement to swing buildings occurred for Forest Park High School and Dorothy I. Height Elementary at 37 percent and 27 percent declines respectively. However, once school programs return to home facilities, the enrollments have increased significantly, such as Fort Worthington Elementary Middle with a utilization of over 100 percent.

PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

The administration and management of this multi-faceted and multidisciplinary program requires that MSA and City Schools continue to work as seamlessly as possible to execute and manage the rigor required for each school project in the 21st Century School Buildings Program. This section provides more detail on how program staffing and procedures, project control software, program audit and oversight as well as the project management, committees and partnerships were implemented during 2020. Important associated program initiatives and collaborations, such as workforce development and minority participation, community engagement efforts, school-based teams, and co-location and facility use collaborations are discussed.

Program Staffing Update and Program Procedures

The MOU clearly defines the roles and responsibilities for high-level programmatic and school project coordination and execution for MSA, City Schools, the City, and the IAC. MSA and City Schools decided in the fall of 2016 that it would be beneficial to the program to have MSA procure and manage all projects under this program. It will be more efficient utilizing all the policies and procedures of one agency. It also allows for both MSA and City Schools to focus on their core strength areas of expertise. Although MSA is the primary party responsible for financial, procurement, contract, and administration of the program, City Schools' 21st Century School Buildings Program office shares responsibility with MSA, in accordance with the MOU on practically every other aspect of delivering the work. The combined program management staffs of MSA and City Schools includes comprehensive administration and procurement management, architecture and interior design expertise, construction and engineering project management, logistics management, education planners, communications, graphics and information technology support, community engagement, public relations, and workforce development management.

City Schools manages all school, community, partnership, and public engagement efforts for each replacement and renovation school project, and swing space sub-projects. City Schools also manages the associated regulatory and communication processes for all schools designated to be closed.

Project Control Software

Meridian Systems supplied Proliance on Demand at the beginning of the program for MSA in order to facilitate communication, reporting, and project status tracking among the multiple entities involved in the program. Proliance software is used to streamline business processes and collaboration, standardize data entry and to provide real-time data through reporting its capabilities for the entire program.

Program Audit and Oversight

MSA employs an internal auditor whose primary function is to review policies, procedures, and compliance on this program. MSA also employs a compliance officer who reviews and approves transactions in high-risk areas of the program.

The School Board approved the engagement of an external audit firm, CohnReznick, to conduct an Internal Risk Assessment and proactive analysis of the processes and procedures of the 21st Century School Buildings Program as it relates to City Schools' roles and responsibilities. In March 2018, after an extensive review, the external audit firm determined that City Schools' risk is minimal due to the transference of all construction activities to the MSA in 2016 and therefore an in-depth audit was not necessary.

PROCUREMENT

As of December 31, 2020, there have been more than 250 procurements and task orders totaling \$1,063,350,933 in contract awards. These awards include, without limitation, contracts for the following services: Program Manager Services, LEED/Green Building Consulting Services, Code Consultants, Risk Management Consulting, OCIP Insurance Brokerage and Administration, A/E planning/design, CM preconstruction/construction services, building commissioning, and testing and inspection services.

MBE Participation

Maximizing MBE participation and inclusion is a goal of the 21st Century School Buildings Program. Each contract is evaluated to determine appropriate MBE goals depending on many factors, including type of service, scope, market availability, and schedule. As of December 31, 2020, total MBE participation is 33.11 percent or \$350,042,030.²

Compliance Systems

MSA uses two systems to monitor compliance with MBE and prevailing wage requirements. MBE awards and payments are verified electronically using B2GNow©, allowing for up-to-date information regarding MBE participation commitment and actual achievement. Further, LCPtracker© is used to monitor compliance with the prevailing wage requirements as well as residency verification for local hiring requirements. GIS capability was added to the system in September 2019.

Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP)

Starting in 2016, MSA implemented an Owner Controlled Insurance Program (OCIP). The OCIP consists of worker's compensation, general liability and excess liability coverages for the construction managers and their subcontractors during the construction phase. MSA also bound builder's risk and contractor's pollution liability to compliment the OCIP coverages. Since the program's inception, 17 projects and 1,132 contractors have been enrolled.

COMMITTEES and PARTNERSHIPS

Executive Committee

Pursuant to the MOU for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools, Section IID establishes the Executive Committee, its duties, and responsibilities. The Executive Committee meets quarterly for the purpose of overseeing, reviewing, and monitoring the performance of the parties as described in the MOU. The Chairmanship of the Executive Committee rotates annually between the parties. The 2018 sessions were chaired by MSA. The 2019 sessions were chaired by the IAC. The 2020 sessions were chaired by City Schools. The 2021 sessions will be chaired by Baltimore City.

The Committee is comprised of participants from the IAC, MSA, City Schools, and the City. During each session, the following reports are presented to the Committee for general discussion and approval as necessary:

- Coordinating Committee
- Collaborative Group
- STAT Committee
- IAC Report
- · Financial Report
- MSA Report
- City Schools Report

Typical reports to the Committee include status updates on the program including schedule, project, and budget updates. The Committee is charged with reviewing and approving items presented during these sessions. The 2020 meeting minutes are available for review on the Executive Committee page of the 21st Century School Building Program website³.

Coordinating Committee

The Coordinating Committee – comprising representatives of the City (Mayor's Office), City Schools, MSA, IAC, Baltimore City Department of Planning (DOP), Baltimore City Department of Recreation and Parks (BCRP), and Baltimore City Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) – works to maximize investments around the 21st Century School Buildings Program projects and community revitalization efforts. The Coordinating Committee is required to meet at least quarterly, in a public meeting, to coordinate and plan for:

- The timing, location, and scope of school facility investments.
- Community development efforts to support the City's revitalization and stabilization goals.
- Citywide or specific school-level education requirements and design standards that impact community development (such as access, recreational uses and sustainability).
- Community and stakeholder involvement in construction projects relevant to community development.

- The identification and use of vacant school buildings consistent with City Schools' annual portfolio review and the potential reuse of surplus or vacated school buildings and facilities by the City.
- Input on each Feasibility Study for all projects during each study's preparation phase, and the opportunity for review and comment before each Feasibility Study is finalized.
- Proposed changes and amendments to the 21st Century School Buildings Program.
- Development of funding strategies to implement improvements that are otherwise not eligible for financing under the bond proceeds or cash on hand.

STAT Committee

MSA chairs the Stat Committee, which is represented by each agency party to the MOU. This Committee meets at least quarterly and reports on key areas of the program such as budget, payments, change orders, MBE, and schedules.

Collaborative Committee

The goals and charges of the Program go beyond just the design and construction of 21st Century Schools to also include collaboration with the broader community. This includes work force development and minority business enterprises. Pursuant to the MOU for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools, Sections II-B and II-C were adopted regarding workforce development and minority business participation as denoted below:

- Workforce Development Section II-B: The City, the School Board, and the Authority
 agreed to establish and participate in a collaborative group (the "Collaborative") to work
 together to maximize the opportunities for the City Schools' students and City residents
 to be informed about, prepared for and connected to work-based learning and
 employment opportunities created by the Program.
- Minority Business Enterprises Section II-C: The Collaborative and the Mayor's Office of Minority and Women-Owned Business Development (MWBD) will work to maximize the utilization of State-certified, locally based, minority- and women-owned businesses.

Minority Business Enterprise

One important goal of the Program is to contribute to the pipeline of qualified, small, local, minority- and woman-owned contractors with the capacity to participate as prime contractors and subcontractors. With this goal in mind and pursuant to the terms of the MOU, the Collaborative and MWBD developed an outreach and inclusion plan ("MBE Plan") ⁴ to be administered by MSA in partnership with MWBD for all funded projects. Further, the Collaborative Committee also created a Supplier Diversity subgroup, chaired by MWBD, which created a supplier diversity plan.

An important component to ensure inclusion of minority and women-owned firms in the Program is to review all contract opportunities to determine the appropriate MBE participation goal and sub-goals based on the specific circumstances of the project. The Program has been very successful in achieving MBE participation, both at the prime and subcontractor levels. **Exhibit 7b**

reflects a summary of all Program awards and the level of MBE participation. As set forth therein, as of December 31, 2020, the Program achieved 33.1 percent in MBE participation.

The MBE Plan also envisions providing educational assistance to local, small, minority- and women-owned firms on methods of doing business on Program-related projects. Since the Program's inception, MSA has participated in over 62 state-wide business outreach events, 14 of which were organized by MSA to discuss specific potential outreach opportunities in the Program and provide technical assistance. MSA will continue to promote the objectives of the MBE Plan and to implement strategies to ensure that these objectives are met.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Local Hiring

In accordance with the MOU, The Mayor's Office of Employment Development (MOED) was charged with developing a comprehensive local hiring plan to support the goals of the Collaborative Committee. This plan leverages the resources of MOED's One Stop Career Center Network and works collaboratively with a broad range of City educational, workforce/training, faith-based and community organizations to assist in the training and preparation of City residents for employment opportunities created by the 21st Century School Buildings Program.

Currently, 17 school buildings housing 19 schools have been completed. Five additional schools have fulfilled their workforce development requirements since our last report. The schools are Arlington Elementary School, Bay-Brook Elementary/Middle School, Calvin M. Rodwell Elementary/Middle School, the Lake Clifton Park Building, and John Ruhrah Elementary/Middle School. The combined local hiring commitment for these schools was 112 Baltimore City residents. The Construction Managers exceeded their individual commitments and hired a total of 237 people. Our office is awaiting final paperwork from Mary E. Rodman Elementary School which opened in Summer 2019.

At the time of award, the Construction Managers for each project commit to hire Baltimore City residents as a condition of their contract. Job retention for local residents is a priority for the Program and we are pleased that local residents have found long term employment as an outcome of the Program. A more in-depth calculation and analysis of payroll records will show how many residents worked multiple positions over the course of these projects.

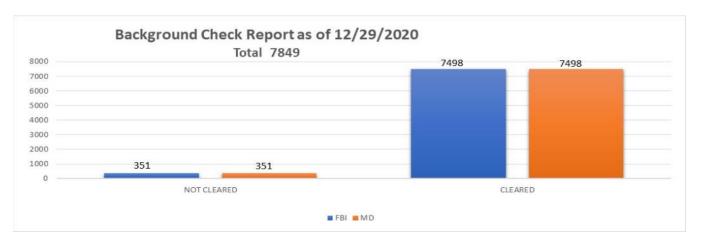

Local Hiring Background Investigation Processing

As of December 29, 2020, City Schools' Human Capital Pre-Enrollment Office has processed approximately 7,849 applications for individuals to work on the 21st Century School Buildings Program projects. Of these, 351 individuals were not cleared.



Due to COVID-19, the Pre-Enrollment office was closed between March 16th to July 3rd. During this time 547 paper applications were accepted for workers through a "temporary work-around process," which allowed for critical hires to begin working without a background check while the office was closed. The office reopened on July 6th rendering services by appointment only, which is scheduled through a customized web-based platform, AppointmentPlus. Since the office reopened, 745 background checks have been completed, including those workers in the "temporary work-around process."

Since creating an "Appeals" process in November 2019 to reduce barriers to employment by allowing applicants who do not pass City Schools background employment to appeal the decision, three of five applicants were able to obtain reversals allowing them to be cleared for work. The applicants utilized the process to explain their circumstances, submit proof of a successful intervention program, and provide a work character letter from their prospective employer. We consider this process a success, and will continue to provide solutions like this, as a partner in the Collaboration Working Group led by the Mayor's Office on Workforce Development, to increase City Resident participation, one person at a time.

Work-Based Learning Program

Since beginning the partnership with Urban Alliance, a Baltimore-based non-profit organization in 2016, 20 students have been paired with 21st Century design and construction firms during their senior year of high school at 21st Century School Buildings Program job sites for internship. The program concluded August 1, 2019 and was scheduled to reconvene March 2020. The internship was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, so no training was held.

However, 21st Century has worked with Urban Alliance to create a "Transition to Worksites Plan" to benefit students and mentors. The hybrid training model is coined "Operating in a Post-COVID-19 Workplace." This new, paid, remote internship plan includes building skills in digital literacy, participating in a national speaker series, and accessing online mentoring. This will be held until such time the impact of COVID-19 has been mitigated.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

Community Engagement

The year 2020 has been a challenging year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The engagement team quickly pivoted its community engagement to a fully virtual model. Prioritizing the safety and security of all our partners and staff, the program elected to use GoToWebinar as its virtual platform, to continue engagement activities and support school construction. The team spent many virtual hours engaging with communities, and school partners in preparation for closures, mergers, feasibility studies, and construction updates. In 2020, the team was able to hold five in-person community meetings before pivoting to GoToWebinar. Since that pivot, the engagement team held 48 virtual community meetings with over 900 attendees. Students, parents, school faculty, and staff were all active participants in providing feedback for each school project. For the safety of all, meetings are continuing to occur virtually in 2021.

In 2020, the engagement team hosted several Feasibility Study meetings. Early in the year, the Plan Year 3 school meetings, which includes the high school programs, were kicked off. These meetings included the historic Baltimore City College High School and the historic Frederick Douglass High School, which is proposed to be co-located with the Joseph C. Briscoe Academy. Meetings were also kicked off in November for Commodore John Rodgers Elementary/Middle School.

In July of 2020, in preparation for the start of construction and to introduce teams, community construction meetings began for Northwood Elementary School. Meetings are held in both English and Spanish to meet the needs of the community. The final construction meetings were held for Medfield Heights Elementary, Walter P. Carter Elementary/Middle, and the Lois T. Murray Elementary/Middle because those schools received Occupancy Certificates in December 2020. Due to COVID-19, the grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony was delayed to late-January 2021. Although Lois T. Murray Elementary/Middle School is completed, the students will not be relocated until June 2021 due to the disruption that a mid-year move would have on the students.

As the program continues to prepare for students to return to school, the engagement team continues to work virtually with merging schools — Calverton Elementary/Middle School, James Mosher Elementary School, and Alexander Hamilton Elementary School, to engage students, families, principals, and teachers. Our student ambassador programs, "Love Our Schools" and "Acts of Kindness" were placed on hold due to COVID-19 because of the amount of in-person coordination, however, in continuing to build solidarity amongst students, identical book bags were acquired for the merging schools, and a partnership was fostered with the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority Inc, Mu Xi Zeta Chapter to obtain 20 Amazon Fire Tablets for student raffle opportunities. Dishiya Joy from Mary E. Rodman Elementary was one of the winners.

Some limited in-person activities were permitted to facilitate the progress of certain initiatives. In August of 2020, a site visit was held with elected officials who represent the Highlandtown Elementary/Middle School #237 district. The meeting discussed the proposed new addition addressing the overcrowding needs at the school, as well as the use of the limited green field area in accommodating the rear addition, while allowing for recreation activities for the community. The walk was attended by Delegate Robbyn Lewis, Councilwoman Danielle McCray, Delegate Luke Clippinger's office, Senator Bill Ferguson's office, the MSA, and JRS Architects.

Another in-person activity that was scheduled as part of the continuous learning process, was the MOU Partner's Retreat held October 21 and 22, 2020. The partners with some Inter-Agency representatives participated in a site tour of Fort Worthington Elementary/Middle, and the REACH! Partnership school in the restored Lake Clifton Park Building to assess how they aligned with the original goals of the Program after occupancy. The attendees received comments from the school leadership, and reviewed challenges, opportunities, and lessons learned since the Program's inception. The feedback is being used as a catalyst to initiate design changes in future buildouts.

INSPIRE

INSPIRE (Investing in Neighborhoods and Schools to Promote Improvement, Revitalization, and Excellence) is the City's effort to bolster the extraordinary investment into the school system. It leverages the 21st Century program to support children's learning and to improve neighborhood conditions and increase the tax base. The INSPIRE plans are facilitated by the Department of Planning (DOP) and created and implemented through many City agencies and community partners. This is a snapshot from 2020.

Plans Adopted and Underway

Eleven INSPIRE plans have been adopted by the Baltimore City Planning Commission. Throughout 2020 seven planning processes were underway: John Ruhrah, REACH! Partnership at Lake Clifton Park Building, Harford Heights, Govans, Mary E. Rodman, Robert W. Coleman, and Medfield Heights. All plans can be found on the INSPIRE web site.

By the Numbers: Improving Streetscapes

Streetscape improvements along primary walking routes are one of the most immediate investments around 21st Century schools. In addition to beautifying the neighborhood, these improvements help ensure safer pedestrian access to the schools for students and others. To date, Baltimore City Department of Transportation has fixed deficient sidewalks along approximately 34 miles and the Department of Recreation and Parks' Tree Baltimore program has planted over 1,350 street trees.

Partnerships Build A Playground in Southwest Baltimore

In December, Baltimore City Recreation and Parks (BCRP) and KaBOOM!, with additional funding from the Baltimore City Children and Youth Fund and INSPIRE, built a new playground at the Mary E. Rodman Recreation Center. The playground was designed, in part, by students from Mary E. Rodman Elementary School, Allendale community members, and other school stakeholders. BCRP is now in design for additional site improvements including a new plaza, ADA accessible circulation, and further expansion of the playground. Until now there hadn't been many places for children to play in the Allendale community. Throughout the Mary E. Rodman INSPIRE planning process, the DOP heard how important a playground was to the Allendale Community Association members and other residents. The playground is one of many examples of multiple City agencies leveraging their resources with external partners to respond to residents' desires surrounding 21st Century schools.

Art Connects Students with Nature in Park Heights

The Pimlico Elementary/Middle School INSPIRE plan identified improving the connection between the school and three important recreational, natural, and educational assets: the Cylburn Arboretum, Jones Falls Trail to the east, and C.C. Jackson Recreation Center to the west. Despite being located just one-half mile from any of these Baltimore gems, there was no physical or social connection from the school. Through funding from the Pimlico Community Development Authority, artists Whitney Frazier and Graham Coriel-Allen along with DOP, BCRP, Cylburn Friends, and Cylburn Combined Communities designed wayfinding public art to connect these resources. Installation of <u>Baltimore Checkerspot Butterfly</u> signs and stencils of flowers along Oakley Avenue was substantially complete at the end of 2020.

Mosaic Learning Platform Enhances Fort Worthington Elementary/Middle School Garden

Break and Make Mosaics (artists Herb Massie and Dominique Hellgeth) worked with students and teachers at Fort Worthington E/MS to design a mosaic structure that celebrates the Fort Worthington neighborhood and the new Fort Worthington Community Garden. The beautiful structure — which features mosaics of the school, houses in the area, and students' hands — was installed in early 2020. Parks & People designed and led a team of contractors to construct a new fence for the garden and will be installing a pathway, sprinkler system, and raised beds in early 2021. Throughout 2020 Brian Burns of United Community Network assisted then-principal, Monique Debi and science teacher, Mrs. Patterson, in maintaining the garden while classes were not in session at the school.

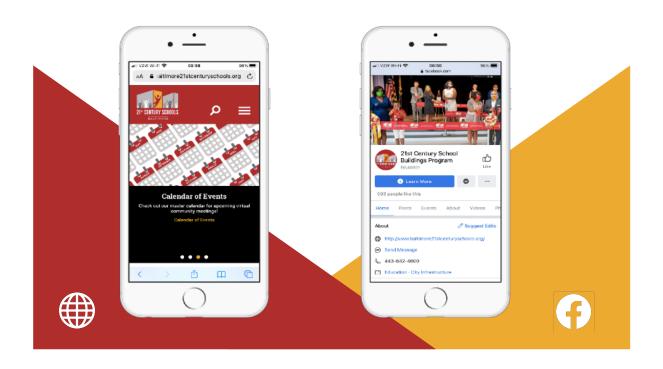

On February 6, a public forum was held at Forest Park High School (a 21st Century School that opened in 2018) to reflect on the Program's history and to look ahead at future school projects. Attendees enjoyed a free dinner provided by students in the Culinary Arts Career and Technology Education (CTE) program, an interactive timeline display of the program's history, student-led tours of the school, and an exhibit of materials from time capsules found during construction. Speakers included Forest Park High School Principal Monica Dailey, Baltimore City Mayor Bernard "Jack" Young, Maryland Stadium Authority Chairman Thomas Kelso, and City Schools CEO Sonja Santelises. The event provided an MOU-required opportunity for community members to share their opinions and feedback during a public comment section and in information sessions about design, academics, community engagement, future projects, and jobs and internships.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the communications toolbox was enhanced to capture the shift to virtual engagement. The communications department has utilized consistent messaging when delivering robocalls and emails to notify stakeholders about meetings and construction site developments and when creating calendar entries on the 21st Century School Buildings Program website, with complementary Facebook event posts. Significant progress was also made to update and improve the technical infrastructure of the Program's website, which continues to serve as the central and most-often relied upon source of information for both the community and for Program partners. The communications team continued reviewing, revising, and managing multiple PowerPoint presentations for community meetings, while coordinating closely with the engagement team to schedule, plan, and promote community engagement meetings.

Also, in response to the ongoing pandemic, the team planned the Program's first "hybrid" grand opening celebration and ribbon-cutting event for the Mary E. Rodman Elementary School on Wednesday, August 26. Unlike previous school openings, this event was closed to the public. In accordance with Baltimore City's COVID-19 guidelines, the in-person audience was limited to twenty-five invited guests and safety protocols (e.g., screenings and social distancing) were followed to mitigate COVID-19 concerns. This event was also livestreamed via City Schools' social media channels and within 24 hours was watched more than 6,000 times.

A combined, virtual grand opening for Medfield Heights Elementary School, and the co-located schools of Walter P. Carter Elementary/Middle School, and Lois T. Murray Elementary/Middle School is scheduled for Wednesday, January 27, 2021. This event will feature a pre-recorded video of all three school spaces and premiere via City Schools' social media channels.

PROGRAM FINANCIAL REPORT

Attached is the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures related to the activities for the Baltimore City Public Schools. Please reference **Exhibit 3** for detailed information.

Revenues

Revenues were higher by \$10.5 million than the budget. The primary reasons for this are related to the true-up of the 2019 bottle tax revenues, table game proceeds and facility rental of \$5.8 million and greater investment\interest income of \$4.3 million, related to the investment of the bond proceeds.

Expenditures

Overall, expenses through June 2020 were \$27.4 million under budget. Below are some of the major variances:

Contractual Services

This category was under budget by \$30.7 million. The budget for construction was very aggressive for the fiscal year.

Grants and Subsidies

This category was over budget by \$3.3 million. This category is to reimburse Baltimore City Public Schools for operating expenses and end-user devices. End-user device invoices for schools opened in prior years were processed for payment in FY 2020.

COMPREHENSIVE MAINTENANCE PLAN UPDATE

The State of Maryland's Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) and the Public School Construction Program (PSCP) require that each Local Education Agency (LEA) establish and annually update a Comprehensive Maintenance Plan (CMP). Our comprehensive plan must describe the Baltimore City Schools' Board of School Commissioner's (School Board) strategy for maintaining its public school facilities, and the plan must also be compatible with the School Board's Comprehensive Educational Facilities Master Plan (CEFMP) and Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). The PSCP analyzes each LEA's plan when capital project funding decisions are undertaken.

Additionally, per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) resulting from the passage of House Bill (HB) 860 by the State of Maryland in fiscal year (FY) 2013 for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools, City Schools must provide a plan for maintaining school buildings and demonstrate progress toward achievement to be measured through a set of 13 Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) metrics approved by the IAC.

Most importantly, the purpose of the CMP is to provide a strategic overview of our facility maintenance program and highlight continuing improvements and new initiatives to increase efficiency and improve quality of services delivered. The CMP details City Schools' organizational structure, plans, and activities established to maintain State and Local Government investment in public school facilities. Representing the School Board, the department of Facilities, Maintenance, and Operations (FM&O) oversees these plans and programs, while the Facility Planning department administers the CEFMP, which includes the CIP.

The plan demonstrates how City Schools' FM&O department:

- Meets the School Board's expectations and aspirations to fulfill the educational goals for Baltimore City school students;
- 2. Works to ensure regulatory compliance;
- 3. Continues to evolve with new technology and updated facility management industry standards; and
- 4. Reports and quantifies performance data for measurable outcomes.

The School Board, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Chief Operating Officer (COO), and Deputy Chief Operating Officer, supported by FM&O, strive to provide a safe and healthy learning environment for students, faculty, and the community while operating our school buildings in an efficient manner. The district's maintenance and preventive maintenance (PM) programs are the foundation necessary to support the educational programs and sustain our facilities.

The relationship between facility maintenance and capital investments is clearly defined and there is an implied understanding that good maintenance of building systems and equipment will defer or reduce the need for capital investments. Also, well-timed and judicious use of capital investment should reduce the burden on maintenance staff, time, and resources while prolonging the life of the building. Both forms of investment are likely to result in better building performance, a reduced risk of building failure, and

savings in operations and utility expenditures. Most importantly, these combined investments will have positive effects on the health and well-being of building occupants.

Facility management professionals use 3 percent of facilities Current Replacement Value (CRV) as a guideline for the annual investment necessary to maintain school buildings in good condition. The FM&O FY2021 operating budget is \$34,143,335. The calculated recommended index value for City Schools would be \$151.9M annually (facility operating budget as a percentage of CRV). City Schools would need to increase the operating budget approximately \$117.8M to achieve this and to bring about a dramatic improvement to school facilities.

With limited resources, the operations department will have to explore more strategic methods to implement day-to-day repair and maintenance tasks, explore alternative funding mechanism such as performance contracting to support replacement of systems, identify supplemental resources and focus on a lean staffing model.

The continual creation of proposed and pending new state regulations and requirements places a heavy burden on the existing availability and usage of maintenance funding. New regulations ultimately lead to the improvement of school facility conditions; however, the current and near-future funding needed to sustain such improvement is not available to fulfill such obligations at this time. Moreover, mandates must be supported with state or local-level, supplemental dollars for complete compliance.

The CMP highlights specific information related to the department's budget, organizational components, staffing structure, and strategies over the next five years measured by performance indicators that were developed in agreement between the IAC and the School Board.

Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) Implementation

Since Fall 2016, FM&O has been incrementally implementing more efficient maintenance practices, inclusive of a more robust and efficient PM program (see timeline). This will result in an extensive asset inventory in the CapitalForecast module within the SchoolDude software package, along with automated PM schedules within the PMDirect module for specific critical building assets. Input for existing buildings was completed in spring 2020 and 21st Century Buildings will be completed when the final building comes online.

Equipment and automated PM schedules for existing school buildings have been placed into SchoolDude and are now auto-generating as of July 2020. For all remaining buildings, including 21st Century buildings, PM work orders will continue to be entered into SchoolDude manually until all pertinent information has been received, reviewed, and uploaded.

Staffing Model

Departmental increases in FY2019 supported mechanical PM work and non-mechanical services, as well as supplemental trade support and additional staffing.

In addition to reducing total square footage, the proposed budget increase should address staffing levels to better support facility needs and challenges, and more importantly, provide additional funding for PM to ensure our facilities stay online. Increased investment in staffing will ensure appropriate oversight and support to address facility deficiencies or minor challenges. Staffing increases will reduce reliance on contractors, that at times, lack historical knowledge of City Schools' facilities, and often present variation in support of facilities based on their own staffing limitations. It's anticipated that by FY2023 FM&O will have 94 percent of the FTEs required to maintain school buildings; however, if funded an additional \$1M in FY2024 FM&O can reach 100 percent capacity.

IAC CMP Review

_

City Schools, in accordance with the MOU, once again increased the annual budget for facilities maintenance and operations (FM&O) and continued to refine its organizational framework in order to deliver the best possible maintenance outcomes. Despite the unexpected and extensive demands associated with COVID-19, City Schools was able to complete more work orders, and more preventive maintenance (PM) work orders than in prior years. In addition, City Schools continued to implement its

computerized maintenance management system (CMMS). As of summer 2020, equipment at all open 21st Century Schools facilities had been inventoried and the CMMS set up to auto-generate PM work orders — which is a critical need for maintenance effectiveness.

Further implementation should include:

- 1. the auto-generation of PM work orders for all City Schools facilities, and
- 2. the use of the CMMS to manage all work orders.

In 2020, state maintenance effectiveness assessments (MEAs) of both new City Schools facilities and older facilities indicated that work orders entered into the CMMS do not represent the full extent of the work needed to effectively maintain the portfolio of City Schools facilities. Whether the additional work orders are entered and remain open until completed or are entered and then deferred; the extent of the work needed cannot be fully met until the need is fully determined. Given that the FM&O budget is more than \$100 million less than the budget needed for effective maintenance of a portfolio of more than 16 million square feet across 150+ facilities, that more work is needed should come as no surprise. And that more work is needed should not discount the improvement in maintenance effectiveness that City Schools has achieved since the inception of the Program in general, and in recent years in particular.

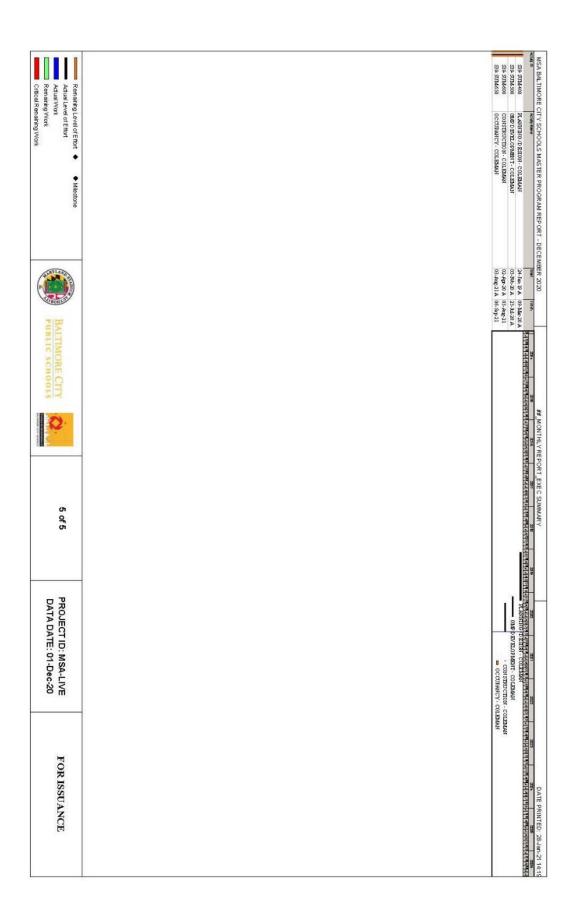

Exhibit 5: Map of Plan Year 1 and Plan Year 2 Schools

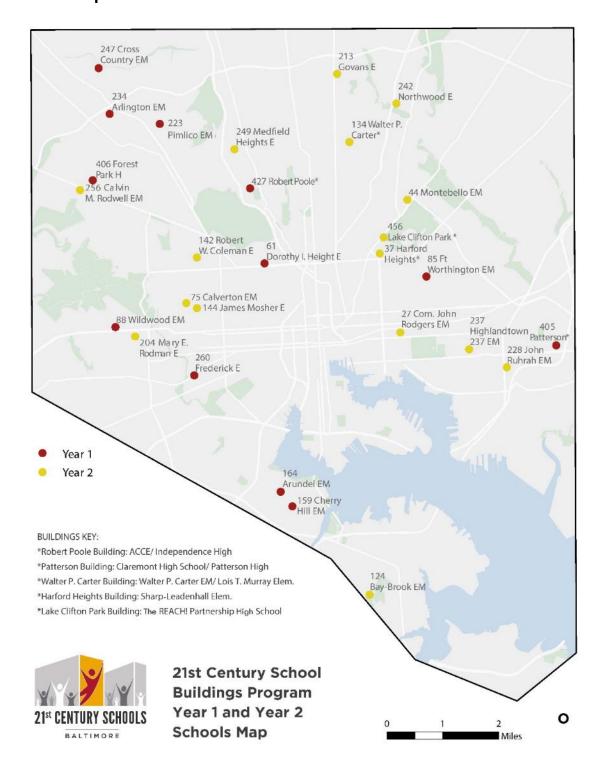

Exhibit 7b: MBE Outreach Inclusion Plan and Commitments

City of Baltimore, Baltimore City Public Schools, and the Maryland Stadium Authority Collaborative Commitment to Supplier Diversity Outreach and Inclusion for Projects under the Act

Background

The Maryland General Assembly passed the Baltimore City Public Schools Construction and Revitalization Act of 2013 (the Act), authorizing the Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to fund up to \$1.1 billion in improvements to Baltimore City public school facilities, resulting in renovation and replacement projects expected to be completed by the end of 2020 (the Projects). Pursuant to the Act, the City of Baltimore (the City), the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners (the School Board), the Interagency Committee on School Construction (IAC), and MSA entered into a four-party Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlining each party's roles and responsibilities. The MOU was approved by the Maryland Board of Public Works on October 16, 2013.

Purpose

The MOU established a collaborative group (the Collaborative), comprising the City, the School Board, and MSA, to work with the

Mayor's Office of Minority and Women-Owned Business Development (MWBD), on an outreach and inclusion plan to promote the utilization of State-certified locally based minority and women-owned businesses on the Projects, in compliance with State law. A subcommittee of the Collaborative, chaired by the MWBD, developed the attached Supplier Diversity Outreach and Inclusion Plan (the Plan) in furtherance of this purpose.

Process

The Supplier Diversity Sub-group, chaired by MWBD, has been formed to ensure that the Plan maximizes opportunities for Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs). The Sub-group will meet no less frequently than quarterly to assess the progress of the Plan. Information about the progress of the Plan will be shared regularly with community stakeholders and by using the Sub-group member organizations as primary communication channels.

Conclusion

While all procurements under the Act must comply with State MBE law, the Collaborative and MWBD have developed the Plan to facilitate the access of Local MBEs to business opportunities generated by the Projects. The Plan's objectives and strategies may be revised as the Projects progress, in an effort to continue to facilitate MBE outreach and inclusion, as well as to comply with State and federal law.

Definitions of Terms in the Plan

Advocacy Partners means business and/or trade associations that are organized to support and promote the utilization of minority and women -owned businesses in public and private procurement and business development opportunities.

City Schools means the Baltimore City Public Schools System, administered by the Chief Executive Officer under the direction and supervision of the School Board.

CRMSDC-certified means a minority-owned, operated, and controlled business that has obtained certification from the Capital Region Minority Supplier Development Council, which is a regional affiliate of the National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC).

Executive Committee means the Executive Committee defined in the MOU.

GOMA means the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs.

Local MBE means an MBE with an address in the MDOT Directory, in the following order of priority: (1) within Baltimore City; (2) within a county that is contiguous to Baltimore City; and (3) within the State.

MSA means the Maryland Stadium Authority or its Program Manager for the Projects (Partners for Revitalization of Baltimore City Schools). **Minority Business Enterprise**, **State-certified MBE**, **or MBE** means a firm that satisfies the definition in Md. Code Ann., State Fin. & Proc.

§14-301(f) and is certified under the State MBE program by the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) under COMAR 21.11.03. A current directory of certified MBEs is available through the MDOT Office of Minority Business Enterprise, 7201 Corporate Center Drive, Hanover, Maryland 21076, (410) 865-1269, 1-800-544-6056, or TTY (410) 865-1342. SBR or Small Business Reserve Program means the program established in Md. Code Ann., State Fin. & Proc. §§14-501 – 14- 505.

STAT Committee means the STAT Committee defined in the MOU.

Supplier Diversity Sub-group means a workgroup, comprising MSA's MBE liaison, a representative of MWBD, a representative of Baltimore City Schools, a representative of GOMA, and representatives of MBE stakeholder organizations who will oversee the administration of the Plan and report to the Executive Committee on this subject. Members of the Supplier Diversity Sub-group who are representatives of MBE stakeholder organizations shall be deemed a "procurement official" under §13-211 of the State Finance and

Procurement Article, Maryland Annotated Code, and an "official" under Title 5, Subtitle 5 of the General Provisions Article, Maryland Annotated Code, for purposes of any response to a request for qualifications, request for proposals, invitation of bids, or other solicitation connected with the Projects and for any awarded contract in connection with the Projects.

WBENC-certified means a woman-owned business that has obtained certification from the Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC), a national 501(c)(3) non-profit organization.

Item 7. FY19 Nonpublic Aging Schools & FY19 Nonpublic School Safety Improvements – Deadline Extension Requests

Motion:

This item is informational only and does not require IAC action.

Background Information:

At their June 25, 2020 meeting, the IAC voted unanimously to delegate authority for the next 12 months to approve project extensions to the Executive Director for projects funded through the Aging Schools Program, the Healthy School Facility Fund, or the School Safety Grant Program, so long as the extensions do not violate any legal requirement. Any granted extensions are to be reported to the Interagency Commission at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

The Nonpublic Aging Schools Program (NASP) and the Nonpublic Schools Safety Improvements (NPSI) function in similar fashion to the Aging Schools Program. The deadline to request reimbursement from the Fiscal Year 2019 allocations was March 31, 2019. Numerous schools contacted the IAC through the Maryland State Department of Education School Facilities Branch (SFB) to request extensions to this deadline due delays to project starts or project completion due the COVID-19 pandemic.

The SFB has reviewed the extension requests and finds them reasonable. The Executive Director has approved extension of the deadline to request reimbursement for these Fiscal Year 2019 projects from March 31, 2021 to December 31, 2021.

Tables identifying the extension requests for both programs are below.

Item 8. FY 2021 Capital Improvement Program Supplemental Information Report

Motion:

This item is informational only and does not require IAC action.

A. Background Information:

In FY 2021, IAC Designees and Staff were tasked with delivering a Supplemental Information Survey to LEAs as a part of the CIP submission process. The IAC and partnering agencies surveyed four categories in which the IAC could differentiate among school systems for project reviews: air conditioning availability in classrooms; design and planning professionals on staff; open space instructional areas; and number of relocatable classrooms per LEA. A summary of the categories examined and their findings is included below. Where data has been collected over several years, we include the results of the surveys over the past 3 or 5 years, if informative.

B. Air Conditioning Availability in Classrooms:

Addressing overheated classrooms became a focus of the Governor and Board of Public Works over the last five years. The IAC adopted The Maryland Public School Facilities Educational Sufficiency Standards on May 31, 2018 which sets a maximum temperature of 75 degrees Fahrenheit for general and specialty classrooms. Schools systems have been working diligently to address this issue with the completion of replacement schools, major school renovations, and systemic renovation projects. The State has been tracking the progress of school systems in addressing this issue for the last 15 years and providing capital support. The following table shows the number and percentage of schools within a school system that do not have a means to cool their classrooms with either a central airconditioning system, package unit(s) within the room, or with window units.

Findings

As of December 2020, 97% of the public schools in Maryland have a means to provide air conditioning in their classroom spaces for the comfort of students and staff. When this survey was first conducted in 2004, only 78% of the schools were air conditioned. Currently, 20 of the 24 school systems report that all of their schools have air conditioning in their classrooms.

The table shows that 52 public schools total in Maryland remain without air conditioning. These include eight in Baltimore County, one in Dorchester, six in Garrett, and 35 in Baltimore City. Baltimore County, Dorchester County, and Baltimore City intend to address these facilities through systemic renovations, facility renovations, or facility replacements within the next 3 years. Only Garrett County Public Schools report that they have no plans to address the 50% of their schools without air conditioning. Due to higher elevations and generally cooler temperatures, there may be less of a need than in other parts of the State to address when prioritized against other school expenditure needs.

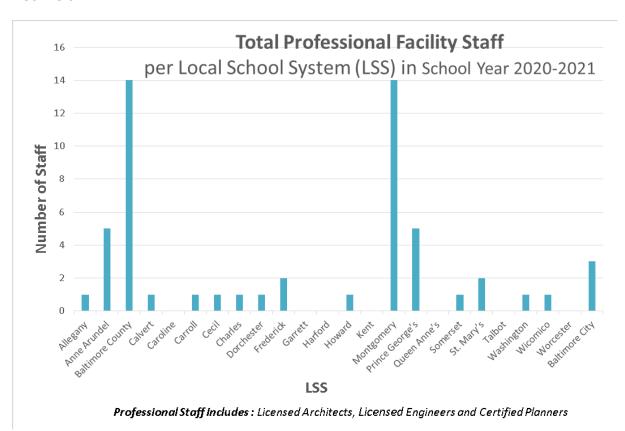

The number of registered, licensed or certified design professionals on the staff of a local board of education is thought to be a measure of the board's internal capacity to perform design reviews and coordinate a range of design disciplines. Since 2006, the IAC staff have tracked the number of registered architects, licensed engineers, and certified planners and reported annually to the IAC.

Findings

The total number of design and planning professionals on staff within school systems throughout Maryland is 55. The graph below provides a pictorial representation of totals collected with the data. Anne Arundel, Montgomery, Prince George's, and Baltimore Counties have the most professionals on their staff. School systems in Caroline, Garrett, Harford, Kent, Queen Anne's, Talbot, and Worcester Counties have no planning or design professionals on their staff. The table includes subtotals for registered architects, licensed engineers, and certified planners as well as indicates the number of professional staff in the State agencies working with the IAC on public schools. Baltimore, Montgomery and St. Mary's counties added professional staff since last year, for an overall statewide increase of seven professionals.

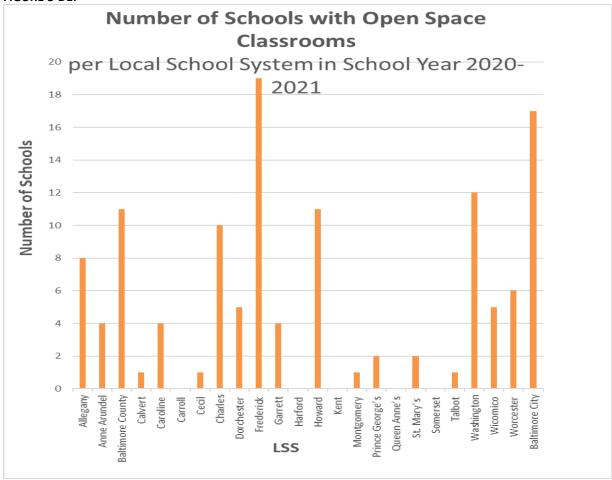
D. Open Space Instructional Areas

A survey has been conducted for the past 5 years to track the amount of public schools remaining in Maryland with open space instructional areas. This includes classrooms with partial-height partitions dividing the instructional areas. These spaces typically share the same mechanical supply and return systems and may have issues with acoustical separation.

Findings

There are a total of 124 schools throughout the state with open space instructional areas. The graph below provides a pictorial comparison of the total number of schools with open space classrooms in each local school system. Frederick County, Baltimore City and Washington County have the greatest number of schools with open spaces.

The following table provides all the data collected, including grade level of the schools and whether there is a plan to address the open space within the next three years. School systems are highlighted where their three-year plans do not address 10 or more open space schools or where more than 25% of their schools will remain open space.

The school system with the highest percentage of open space classrooms within its school system is Worcester County with 43% of its schools (or 6 total) that are not planned to be addressed in the next 3 years. Worcester County maintains lower class sizes than many school systems and finds open space classrooms less of an educational challenge. Frederick County has the highest number of open space schools in the state (18 total) that are not planned to be addressed within the next three years, which is 26% of the total number of schools within their school system. Baltimore City has the next highest number of current open space schools at 17, but they plan to address seven of them within the next three years. This leaves 11 or 7% of the total number of schools within this school system that are not set to be addressed as of yet.

E. Relocatable Classrooms

In School Year 2020–2021, there are 2,923 relocatable classrooms in use for instruction in Maryland's 24 local school systems. This includes both local and state owned. The total is a 7 classroom decrease from School Year 2019-2020. Nine school systems reported increases and seven reported decreases. The graphs below provide a pictorial representation of key data.

Findings – Amount of Relocatable Classrooms

As in the previous five years, Montgomery and Prince George's counties are using the most relocatable classrooms of 467 and 537 respectively. Baltimore, Charles and Howard counties also show significant use of relocatable classrooms. While school districts are planning to construct new school buildings and additions, the need for relocatables will continue given the steady increase in student enrollment in certain school districts and the need to provide space during construction projects.

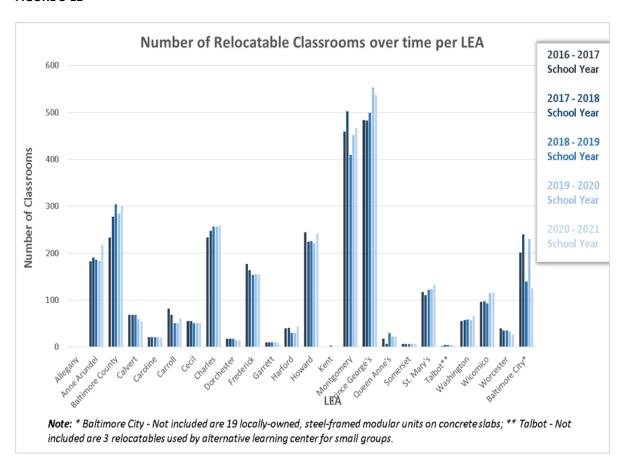

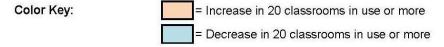

Findings – Five-Year Average of Total Number of Relocatable Classrooms

The 5-year average number of relocatable classrooms in use for instruction is part of the eligibility criteria for Capital Grant Program for Local School Systems with Significant Enrollment Growth or Relocatable Classrooms (EGRC) funding. Beginning in FY22, the 5-year average to qualify for EGRC funding was reduced from 300 to 250. This average was based on the 2015-2019 average and Baltimore County became eligible. The 2016-2020 average is used for the FY23 eligibility and Charles County will also become eligible.

Findings – Age of Relocatable Classrooms

The IAC has not purchased any new classrooms since 1990. The average age of the State-owned inventory is 42 years, extending beyond the useful life of such type facilities. When considering locally-owned as well as State-owned units, nearly 14% of relocatable classrooms are in units over 30 years

old. An estimated 301 classrooms are in relocatable units over 30 years old with Prince George's, Baltimore City, and Baltimore County each having over 50 classrooms in aging relocatables.

Background Information:

Attached is the IAC's 2021 legislation tracker, updated as of April 14, 2021. The tracker contains bills that were passed by both houses and that may impact the IAC and its various programs or have some other impact on public school construction.

Of particular note during the 2021 session are the enactment of the Built to Learn Act of 2020 (which was presented to the IAC at their meeting on March 11, 2021. Also significant is the passage of SB 551 "21st Century School Facilities Act and Built to Learn Act - Revisions" which was passed by both chambers but has not yet been signed by the governor. If the bill is enacted, it will:

- Hold harmless LEAs that would see a decrease under the State cost share calculation for fiscal years 2023 and 2024
- Require the Workgroup on the Assessment and Funding of School Facilities to make recommendations regarding:
 - o the factors used in the State cost share calculation
 - o the methods used to establish the IAC's Gross Area Baselines
 - the long-term effects of school construction decisions, including appropriate funding or incentives to reduce the cost per student and the total cost of ownership
- Modify the Healthy School Facility Fund to allow roof projects and to require the IAC to
 establish a separate procedure for allocations to Baltimore City (who are required to receive
 50% of available funding for fiscal years 21 through 24)
- Modify some requirements for public-private partnership projects in Prince George's County
