Dear Dr. Salmon, Mr. Gorrell & Distinguished Members of the IAC:

Carroll County appreciates the challenges of rolling out a new school construction funding program, and we look forward to working with the IAC and Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to access the additional funding to replace our oldest school building, East Middle School. Unfortunately the structure and timing of the Built to Learn Act funding are presenting obstacles to moving ahead with this critical project. Carroll County is one of 17 LEAs competing for 11.5% of the funds outlined in the Built to Learn Act. Unlike the seven counties granted a specific allocation in the law, the 17 counties are still unaware of how much money will be allocated to them over the coming years. The expected timing of the funding allocations and project approvals does not correspond to the local decision making processes. Local county governments adopt their capital budgets in May, but IAC staff have indicated that information regarding allocations and project approvals will not be provided until later in the summer.

Based on the initial passage of the Built to Learn Act, our Board of Education and County Government made the decision last May to move ahead with the design of this project so that we would be shovel ready for the first round of funding from the Built to Learn Act. The construction schedule, project budget, and funding plan are all dependent upon this project starting construction this summer. Due to the delay in receiving allocations and project approval decisions for Built to Learn funding, our County government is being asked to commit local funding for fiscal year 2022 without a firm State commitment to the East Middle project. Under the traditional CIP scenario, we would secure State Planning approval and/or initial construction funding in order to indicate the State's commitment to the project. Unfortunately, implementation of the Built to Learn Act funding is not following traditional CIP approval processes and, thus far, we have been unable to secure a firm State commitment for this project. This puts our County in an uncertain position regarding the East Middle project. The funding they have built into their current CIP is based on the State providing \$24,000,000 for this project. Our County would like to know if the State is committed to this project before they adopt their FY2022 Capital Budget at the end of May.

Without some level of State commitment, our County Government will face two difficult options to make this project happen. One option would be for the County to cover the State share in FY22 with no proof of the State's financial commitment. They would be making this decision solely based on faith that the \$24 million dollars from the State will be provided to this project. The second option would be to delay the project until a

firm State commitment can be provided. This option would increase the total cost of the project by millions of dollars and delay the timeline for replacing an aging building with failing systems. Neither of these options are tenable, and we will continue to work with the State to avoid putting the County in a situation where they have to select one of these difficult options.

Although the additional funding being provided through the Built to Learn Act has made the timing of this project possible, ironically, the non-traditional nature of the program also has the potential to jeopardize this project moving forward. It has been communicated to us that the IAC cannot begin approving Built to Learn projects until MSA determines how many bonds they will be able to issue in FY22. However, we believe that the IAC alone has the ability to determine the allocations for the 17 counties without a specified amount in the law. We do not believe this determination is dependent upon the timing of funding, as it was not necessary for the larger counties who have already received their allocations. If the IAC was able provide Carroll County with its allocation of the Built to Learn Act funds then this would provide some level of State funding commitment to Carroll County for the next few years. This level of commitment would put the County in a much better position to consider forward funding the State share of construction. Therefore we respectfully request that the IAC consider expediting the process to determine the funding allocations for the 17 counties so that this information can be communicated to local governments prior to the adoption of local capital budgets.

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda. Director Gorrell reminded the members that due to the long agenda at today's IAC Meeting, Informational Reports with no presentation have been included as reading materials for the Members in the consent agenda.

2. Facility Status Change Items

Michael Bayer, Manager of Infrastructure and Development for the Maryland Department of Planning, presented 7 facility status change items to the IAC.

A. Baltimore City Public Schools - Approval of Eight Property Transfers - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented a March 15, 2021 letter from Baltimore City Public Schools requesting approval of the transfer of eight properties from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. Upon IAC approval, City Schools will transfer ownership of the eight buildings to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore. The Mayor and City Council would be required to reimburse the state for the total outstanding bond debt service on the buildings, and to seek IAC approval before subsequent transfers.

Upon a motion from Ms. Avara and a second by Ms. Lawlah, the members voted unanimously to approve the transfer of the dedicated use of eight (8) Baltimore City Public Schools buildings as listed, from the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in accordance with the Annual Review of Schools: 2020-2021 Recommendations, approved by the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners on January 12, 2021 and in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public Schools dated December, 2016; with the agreement that the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall reimburse the state the total outstanding bond debt service in the amount of \$1,037,232.45 by the scheduled



dates provided by the State Treasurer's Office. The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall obtain approval of the Interagency Commission on School Construction before transferring any right, title, or interest to any portion of the property.

B. Montgomery County - Crown High School Site Approval - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented background information on the Montgomery County Board of Education request for site approval of the Crown High School site, located at 9400 Fields Road in Gaithersburg. The property is currently owned by the City of Gaithersburg and will be dedicated, at no cost, to the Montgomery County Board of Education for the use of a public high school, per an annexation agreement between the developer and the City of Gaithersburg, recorded at the Land Records of Montgomery County, dated December 7, 2010. On June 26, 2019, VII Crown Farm Owner, LLC conveyed the approximately 30.68 acre future school site parcel to the City of Gaithersburg. When the state approval process is complete, a deed from the City of Gaithersburg will be recorded at the Land Records of Montgomery County. The new school project has been identified in the approved Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Capital Budget and the FY 2021–2026 Capital Improvements Program for completion by August 2026.

The site was one of three evaluated. The estimated cost of construction is \$136.2 million. The school has a proposed capacity of 2,700 students in grades 9-12 and will serve the mid county region of Montgomery County. The Montgomery County Board of Education approved the site on July 18, 2006. State Clearinghouse review was completed in March 2021.

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second from Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the use by the Montgomery County Board of Education (MCBOE) of 30.68 acres at 9400 Fields Road, Gaithersburg, MD, 20878, on the tract known as Lot 1, Block GG, Crown Farm, for the construction of a Crown High School, with a scheduled opening in August 2026; adhering to the actions identified in the state clearinghouse review, state identifier MD20210128-0051.

C. Anne Arundel County - Reece Road Disposal - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented a request from the Anne Arundel County Board of Education, seeking approval from the Interagency Commission for School Construction to transfer 10.6 acres of land to the Anne Arundel County government for the development of the Severn Intergenerational Center. The 27,000-square foot center would include a 13,500-square foot senior center. Under the terms of an agreement between the AACBOE and the county government dated October 30, 2020, the Board of Education would transfer the unimproved parcel, which the Board of Education acquired in 1972, and retain 28.9 acres that contains Van Bokkelen Elementary School, just to the east, and a future school site directly behind the proposed center and existing school.

Upon a motion from Ms. Avara and a second from Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the transfer of 10.6 acres of land, at 1140 Reece Road, Severn, Maryland, 21144, an unimproved property adjacent to Van Bokkelen Elementary School, from the Anne Arundel County Board of Education to Anne Arundel County government for use as the future Severn Intergenerational Center, with associated access and pedestrian easements to allow for future Board of Education access to the property; and to allow the use by the Anne Arundel County Board of Education of the 15.67-acre adjacent Meade Village Park site, at 1760 Meade Village Circle, Severn, MD, 21144, for future athletic, recreational and park activities at Van Bokkelen Elementary School and an associated future school site, under a future shared use agreement for the Meade Village Park site.



D. Dorchester County Transfers - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented a request from the Dorchester County Board of Education to make a minor modification of parcel boundaries in coordination with the Dorchester County Government, so that all of the recreational uses behind Hurlock Elementary School, at 301 Charles Street in Hurlock, are on county-owned property. Under the revision, the school would occupy Tax Parcel 440, controlled by the Board of Education, thus reducing its size from 5.267 to 3.963 acres, and the ballfield and concession stand would occupy Tax Parcel 1452, owned by Dorchester County, which would increase in size from 13.356 to 14.64 acres. The change is being made to clarify the liabilities assumed by the Board of Education, for the school facilities, and the Parks and Recreation for the recreational facilities.

Upon a motion from Secretary McCord and a second from Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve a minor modification of parcel boundaries and transfer of property from the Board of Education of Dorchester County to the Dorchester County Government of Tax Parcel 440, occupied by Hurlock Elementary School, 301 Charles Street, Hurlock, MD, 21643, and Tax Parcel 1452, directly behind the school, which is owned by the Dorchester County Government and occupied by a ballfield and concession stand, so that all existing recreational uses are on county-owned property.

E. Harford County - Havre de Grace High School - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented a request from the Harford County Board of Education requesting approval from Harford County Government for ultimate disposal to the City of Havre de Grace for a community use that will "create opportunities that will strengthen the Havre de Grace community and enhance economic vitality." With the construction of the new Havre de Grace Middle/High Replacement School, the Harford County Public Schools have no use for the existing building and declared it surplus. Officials from Harford County, the City of Havre de Grace and HCPS all endorsed the action in 2019.

Secretary McCord noted that the city of Havre de Grace has a requirement that acquisition and disposition of property must be placed on referendum and voted on in municipal elections.— This means that IAC approval is just a first step in the process of transferring property to the city..

Upon a motion from Secretary McCord and a second from Ms. Avara, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the transfer and disposal as surplus property by the Harford County Board of Education of the former Havre de Grace High School Auditorium/Gymnasium Building, at 700 Congress Avenue, Havre de Grace, MD, 21078, to the Harford County Government, for disposition to the City of Havre de Grace as future community use space.

F. Property Easements - [Motion Carried]

Michael presented a table of 6 property easements for IAC approval.

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second from Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the conveyance by the following Board of Education of the easements specified in the table below.

G. Property Name Change - [Informational Only]

Michael presented a property name change to the IAC from Montgomery County. The Col. E. Brooke Lee Middle School has changed its property name to Odessa Shannon Middle School. This item is informational only and does not require IAC action.



3. FY23 Cost per Square Foot for School Construction - [Motion Carried]

Wanda Ascencio, Manager of Fiscal Services for the IAC, presented an update on the requirement for the IAC to establish the average Statewide per-square-foot school building cost that will apply to the capital improvement program by July of the calendar year in which applications are submitted. The calculation was based upon recent school construction bids, including new and renewed construction projects within the last 6 - 12 months. This includes 1 high school, 1 middle school, and 4 elementary schools, with an average cost of \$348 per square foot. The IAC recommends that the IAC increase the cost per sf figure to be used for the FY 2023 CIP to \$353 per sf for building only. This is a 3.5% increase over the FY22 cost per square foot figure of \$341 for building only.

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second from Ms. Avara, the IAC voted unanimously to adopt the FY 2023 Statewide per-square-foot school building costs of \$353 per sf for building only.

4. Carroll County - Westminster East Middle School Replacement - Gross Area Baseline Variance - [Motion Carried]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager for Carroll County, presented a request from Carroll County Public Schools that the IAC support a Gross Area Baseline (GAB) variance for the Westminster East Middle School replacement project to support two countywide special-education programs to be co-located in this replacement school project.

Jamie reminded the members that at the May 9, 2019 meeting of the IAC, the Commission adopted revised Gross Area Baselines (GABs) for the determination of the gross square footage eligible for state support in capital school construction projects. In contrast to the Maximum Gross Area Allowances, the GABs "enable an IAC variance process by which the IAC may grant additional square footage allowances on a case-by-case basis upon an LEA's request and presentation of sufficient data supporting the need for additional square footage." This is in recognition of the fact that right-sizing for school facilities is not "one size fits all."

Upon a thorough review of the floorplans and additional spatial information, IAC Staff recommend that a GAB variance of an additional 54.8 GSF per special education student — or 2,740 total GSF — to provide the space needed for the self-contained special-education suite. The resulting GAB eligible for State participation would be adjusted up to an estimated 102,018 GSF, from the current estimated 99,278.

In response to questions from the Commission, Director Gorrell noted that this variance, if approved, would be the second GAB variance granted by the Commission since adoption of the new GABs in May 2019.Ms. Eberhart asked whether Carroll County is satisfied with this compromise, and Mr. Bridges informed the members that he has spoken with Carroll County prior to this meeting and they are in agreement with the recommendation.

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second from Mr. Kasemeyer, the IAC voted unanimously to approve a gross area baseline (GAB) variance that will support an additional 2,740 gross square feet (GSF) for the Westminster East Middle School (PSC 06.004) replacement project, increasing the gross area eligible for state support from 99,278 GSF to 102,018 GSF (inclusive of cooperative use space) for a justifiable planning enrollment of 671 students, consistent with the provisions of COMAR 14.39.02.06E.



5. Baltimore City Public Schools - Cancellation of Two FY 2020 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) Projects at Eutaw-Marshburn Elementary #011 - [Motion Carried]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager for Baltimore City, presented a letter dated April 9th, 2021, requesting the cancellation of the VPU installation project and the window and door replacement project at Eutaw-Marshburn Elementary #011. According to the LEA, the design process revealed the need for additional, extensive structural repairs that must be completed in order to support the VPU installation project and the windows and doors replacement project. The scope and cost estimate for improvements at Eutaw-Marshburn Elementary #011 will be revised to incorporate the needed structural repairs, and the project will be submitted as a future CIP project.

Members of the Commission expressed concern over the cancellation of the HVAC projects for the Eutaw project and asked if the City has a specific timeline for completion of the new scope.Mr. Bridges noted that IAC staff are currently working with Baltimore City to understand the new project timeline.

Upon a motion from Ms. Lawlah and a second from Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the cancellation of two (2) FY 2020 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) projects at Eutaw-Marshburn Elementary #011; in accordance with Education Article §5-303(j)(3)(i), and the transfer of the combined allocation of \$2,466,360 to the Statewide Reserved Appropriation Account for Baltimore City Public Schools.

6. Baltimore City Public Schools - 21st Century School Buildings Program Annual Report - [Motion Carried]

Jamie Bridges, Regional Facilities Manager for Baltimore City, presented the 21st Century School Buildings

Program Annual Report. The Maryland Stadium Authority has assumed the lead in producing the report,
which is adopted by the Maryland Stadium Authority, Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools), the City
of Baltimore (City), and the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC).

Mr. Bridges highlighted that of the 12 year-one projects, 11 are currently occupied with 1 to be occupied in the fall. Of the 17 year-two projects, 7 are occupied, 6 are under construction, and 4 are under design. The majority of these projects are expected to be completed by the end of 2021, while a few are expected to slip into FY 2023 due to swing space conflicts. The main responsibilities of the IAC and the annual report include a review of Baltimore City Schools projected district-wide utilization, found on page 280, and a review of Baltimore City Schools maintenance plans, found on page 301.

Upon a motion from Ms. Eberhart and a second from Ms. Avara, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the annual report, dated January 2021, by the parties in compliance with the Memorandum of Understanding for the Construction and Revitalization of Baltimore City Public School to the Governor, the Board of Public Works, and the fiscal committees of the general assembly on the progress of replacements, renovations, and maintenance of Baltimore City public schools.

7. FY19 Nonpublic Aging Schools & FY19 Nonpublic School Safety Improvements – Deadline Extension Requests – [Informational Only]

Fred Mason, School Facilities Branch Chief, presented a table identifying extension requests for the Nonpublic Aging Schools Program and the Nonpublic School Safety Improvements Program.

At their June 25, 2020 meeting, the IAC voted unanimously to delegate authority for the next 12 months to approve project extensions to the Executive Director for projects funded through the Aging Schools Program, the Healthy School Facility Fund, or the School Safety Grant Program, so long as the extensions



do not violate any legal requirement. The Nonpublic Aging Schools Program (NASP) and the Nonpublic Schools Safety Improvements (NPSI) function in similar fashion to the Aging Schools Program. The deadline to request reimbursement from the Fiscal Year 2019 allocations was March 31, 2021. Numerous schools contacted the IAC through the Maryland State Department of Education School Facilities Branch (SFB) to request extensions to this deadline due delays to project starts or project completion due the COVID-19 pandemic.

The School Facilities Branch has reviewed the extension requests found in the IAC Agenda and finds them reasonable. The Executive Director has approved extension of the deadline to request reimbursement for these Fiscal Year 2019 projects from March 31, 2021 to December 31, 2021.

8. Supplemental Information Report – [Informational Only]

Fred Mason presented a report on supplemental information to the FY21 Capital Improvement program. The IAC and partnering agencies surveyed four categories in which the IAC could differentiate among school systems for project reviews: air conditioning availability in classrooms; design and planning professionals on staff; open space instructional areas; and number of relocatable classrooms per LEA. A summary of each of these categories can be found in the IAC Agenda. Where data had been collected over multiple years, School Facilities Branch have included the results from the last 3 - 5 years of data.

9. Legislative Update – [Informational Only]

Cassandra Viscarra, Chief of Staff to the IAC, presented the IAC's 2021 legislative tracker, updated as of April 14th, 2021. The tracker now includes only the bills that have passed both chambers of the General Assembly. However, Cassandra noted that while they have passed through both chambers, none of these bills have been signed by the Governor. By June 1st, all legislative activity will be finalized.

Dr. Salmon complimented the Executive Director and his staff by how they have streamlined and improved the processes for the IAC and continue to make improvements year over year.

Adjournment:

Upon a motion from Mr. Gibbons and a second from Mr. Kasemeyer, the IAC members voted unanimously to conclude the meeting at 10:07 a.m.

Effective June 1, 2018, Education Article §5-314, Annotated Code of Maryland prohibits the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) from approving change orders. On October 9, 2018, the IAC approved a transitional change order policy to define how the IAC staff will review change orders for projects approved in the FY 2019 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and earlier. It was determined that each LEA would be presented the opportunity to request review of change orders for current active projects and that any individual project contingency funds will be reverted to the LEA Reserved Appropriation account. The above change orders represent grandfathered projects for which the LEA elected to participate in change order review for potential State participation.

Item 2. FY 2022 100% Capital Improvement Program and Approval of NonPublic Aging Schools Program Reversions

Motion:

- 1. To approve the reversion of \$471,511 unexpended appropriation of the Senator James E. "Ed" DeGrange Nonpublic Aging Schools to the Unreserved Statewide Appropriation account for the Capital Improvement Program pursuant to Chapter 63, Laws of Maryland 2021(HB590) as presented in this item;
- 2. To approve the Fiscal Year 2022 Capital Improvement Program in the total amount of \$394.795 million, including \$376.170 million for allocation to funding and planning projects as specified for each local school system in the attached document dated May 27, 2020, \$.5 million for Department of General Services (DG) design consultant fees and \$6 million new authorization held for unanticipated project costs; and
- 3. To authorize the IAC staff to make minor technical corrections or adjustments to allocations based on calculation of the project's net state funding amount to avoid the over or under funding of a project.

Background Information:

In accordance with Chapter 63, Laws of Maryland 2021 (HB590) which included language providing that grants made to nonpublic schools shall be expended within 3 years of the date that funding for the grants became available. Any funding for grants that is unexpended following 3 years of having become available shall be transferred to the Unreserved Statewide Appropriation Account for public school construction. The amounts to be transferred are shown in column 4, in the table below by fiscal year:

FY 2022 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program

In compliance with Maryland law (Education Article §5-304(b)(5), Annotated Code of Maryland, the IAC shall approve, on or after May 1 every year, public school construction projects that comprise 100% of the school construction allocation included in the capital budget bill as enacted.

The available funding being recommended for the FY 2022 CIP consists of \$285 million in preliminary new bond authorization in accordance with the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan (MCCBL) of 2021, \$60.9 million in FY 2022 and Prior Year Supplemental Enrollment Growth and Relocatable Classroom (EGRC) funds, \$30.1 million in prior year appropriations and \$0.482 million in Nonpublic Aging School Funding which is being reverted to the Capital Improvement Program after not being appropriated within 3 years.

Requests for the FY 2022 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) were submitted by the 24 LEAs and the Maryland School for the Blind totaling \$766.596 million for 164 projects, as well as 46 requests for planning approval. See Table 1.

Motion:

To approve, contingent upon final execution of a Program MOU between the IAC and the Maryland Stadium Authority as required by Economic Development Article § 10-650(e), projects as presented to be funded and executed through the Built to Learn Act, with allocations estimated to total approximately \$250 million. Final funding amounts are subject to adjustment based upon finalization of project worksheets and review of project eligibility.

Background Information:

The Built to Learn (BTL) Act of 2020 was enacted into law in 2020 and became effective February 12, 2021. The Act authorizes the Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to sell revenue bonds to fund up to \$2.2 billion in school construction projects approved by the IAC. Currently, based upon information from MSA, IAC will base its approval on total estimated available funding of \$1.8 billion until such time as the final available amount can be determined based upon available debt service payments to support the bonds.

Since the bill became effective, IAC staff and the MSA have been meeting regularly to coordinate and to finalize the necessary programmatic details. Based upon initial estimates, MSA has begun to prepare for the first bond sale to support the Built to Learn program. Bond proceeds are anticipated to be available late summer/early fall.

Attached is a listing of projects that have been identified as appropriate candidates, based upon their shovel-ready status within the Counties that have specific allocation percentages in the Act, for the first available Built to Learn Funding, and that were either allocated partial funding or were deemed eligible but deferred due to fiscal constraints in the FY 2022 Public School Construction Program.

IAC staff are recommending approval of the projects as presented for funding through the Built to Learn program at the maximum State Funding Allocation identified, contingent upon enactment of the Program MOU required by the Built to Learn Act. IAC staff and MSA have

been working on a draft MOU and expect to execute the final MOU soon. The IAC will continue to work with all LEAs to identify projects that can utilize potential available bond funds in FY 2022, including the recommended \$250 million and the potential for up to another approximately \$150 million for an estimated total FY 2022 allocation of \$400 million. Concurrently, the IAC will also work with LEAs to identify projects that will be sufficiently developed to utilize funding in future fiscal years.

Per the Act, there are 17 Counties that are not specifically named that will share 11.5% of the available funding. Upon approval of this item, the IAC will work to solicit applications for projects from each of the 17 Counties. Eligibility may be initially capped at each LEA's proportional share (as calculated based upon September 2019 enrollment) of the estimated available \$207 million as total requests are solicited. The IAC staff will also recommend a minimum project size in order to ensure that each project executed through the program can be successfully managed and will have a meaningful impact on Maryland's students. LEAs will be encouraged to identify potential BTL projects as soon as possible regardless of when the projects may become shovel-ready so that the IAC and MSA can estimate the cash flow requirements for the 17 LEAs that share the 11.5% allocation.

Unlike the traditional Public School Construction Program, the Built to Learn Act requires that the IAC approve projects for participation in the program on a rolling basis. IAC staff will recommend additional projects for approval in FY 2022, based upon additional information received from the LEAs, in the coming months.

Item 4. Carroll County - Winfield Elementary PSC #06.023.20 SR - Decrease Reverted Project State Construction Allocation

Motion:

To approve a change to IAC Meeting held on July 9, 2019, Item 1.B.7 for Carroll County Public Schools - Winfield Elementary mechanical replacement project by changing the Project Allocation decrease amount for 06.023.2020 SR from \$1,732,949 to \$987,059 and changing the Increase to State Appropriation account 40.000.2020 from \$1,732,949 to \$987,059.

Background Information:

On July 9, 2019, the IAC approved a contract for the Carroll County Winfield Elementary mechanical replacement project PSC #06.023.20 SR – Mechanical) and a corresponding project allocation decrease to align the project allocation with the necessary contract amount. In July 2020, Carroll County Public Schools (CCPS) terminated the same contract for convenience and in December 2020, the IAC approved the termination and revised state participation in the project accordingly. In order to complete the mechanical project, CCPS planned to bundle the uncompleted scope of work with the FY 2021 roof project at Winfield Elementary (PSC #06.023.12/13/14 SR – Roof).

Bids received in response to subsequent solicitations for the mechanical project at Winfield Elementary were all well above the estimated completion cost of \$1.833 million, with a lowest responsive bid of \$3.995 million. In an email dated April 23, 2021, CCPS requested that the IAC provide additional participation in the project to meet funding needs.

After review and collaboration with CCPS staff, IAC staff recommend that the IAC amend the project allocation reversion approved at the July 2020 IAC meeting from \$1,732,949 to \$987,059, which will restore funding in the amount of \$745,890— which is approximately ½ of the calculated state share of the \$2.528 million cost escalation. This reversion adjustment of \$745,890 will reduce the statewide reserved appropriation account and increase the project allocation to a maximum of \$3,912,301 for the mechanical project at Winfield Elementary — allowing CCPS to complete the project in time for the start of school year 2021-22.

Background Information:

Education Article §5-303(j)(3)(i) requires Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project allocations uncontracted after two years to be transferred to the Statewide Reserved Appropriation Account, and reserved for reallocation to other eligible CIP projects in the LEA.

At its meeting on February 15, 2017 (page 49), the IAC, at the request of the Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) approved the termination of the contract for the air conditioning project at Bowie High School PSC #16.089.13EEI/14 SR. It was the intent of PGCPS to redesign the project and rebid. It is our understanding that this has not occurred. Given the time that has lapsed and the lack of progress on the project the IAC staff recommend that the FY 2014 CIP PGCPS air conditioning project allocation at Bowie High School be canceled and the expenditures of \$219,808, refunded to the State Public School Construction Program. It was noted in the previous IAC approval that the refund would be required if the scope of work was not completed.

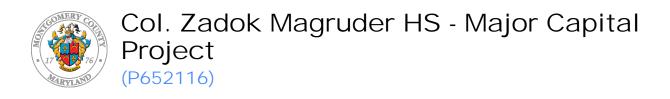

According to the LEA, it would be more cost-efficient to complete the pool repairs as part of the City College renovation project — which is anticipated to be completed with Built-to-Learn (BTL) bond funds. The renovation is now in the planning / pre-design phase of project development.

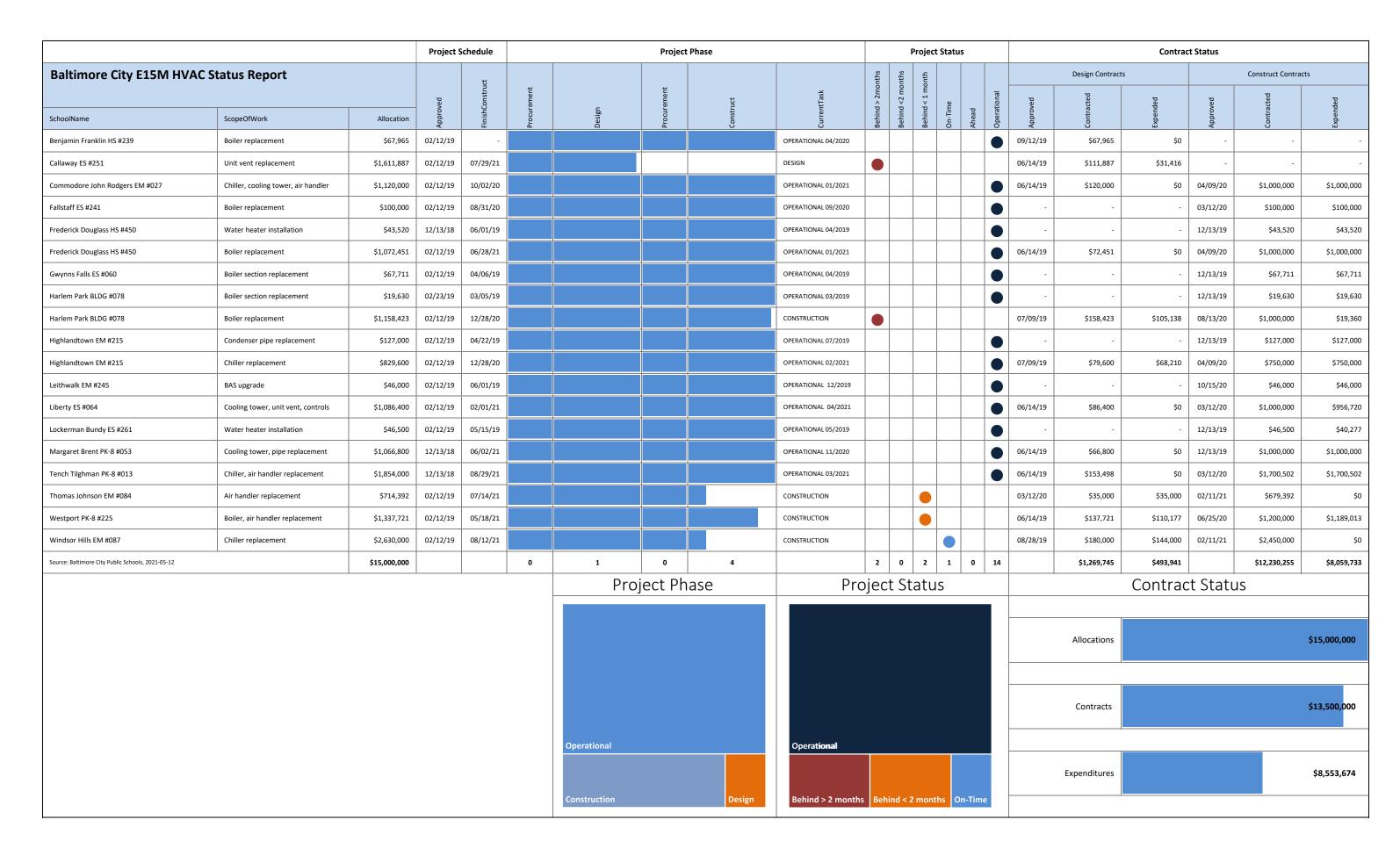

Background Information:

The IAC approved proposed COMAR revisions for publication at their meetings on February 11 and March 11, 2021.

IAC staff recommends the final adoption of proposed actions on regulations, published in the April 23, 2021 Maryland Register.

After initial publication of this agenda, the IAC received public comment (attached). However, the public comment has not resulted in recommendations for revisions to the COMAR because:

- It is up to the LEAs to determine what is needed to deliver the education program;
- The Educational Specifications Workgroup recommended legislation to make it clear that Maryland State Department of Education Guidelines were recommendations, not requirements, so that right-sized spaces may differ from one LEA to another;
- Current statute directs the IAC to allow design, fixtures, furniture, and equipment as well as other soft costs to be eligible;
- Even with the change, LEAs can elect to include ancillary improvements and building components such as carpeting and paint, which will be eligible for Stat participation under the Limited Renovation category, which requires the distinction between systemic renovations and limited renovations.

Next Steps: If approved by the IAC, notice will be published in the Maryland Register that the IAC adopted the proposed regulations as amended. The regulations go into effect 10 days after publication.

Re: Amendment to Regulation - Definition of Limited Renovation (COMAR 14.39.01.01)

Dear Ms. Viscarra:

I would like to offer background information regarding the proposed change to the definition of Limited Renovation (COMAR 14.39.01.01) in the April 23, 2021 issue of the *Maryland Register*, and to express concerns about the amendment to the regulation. The amendment, which will make the inclusion of "widespread educational or architectural enhancements" an elective aspect of a Limited Renovation project, reads as follows:

"Limited renovation" means to upgrade an existing building and site, or a portion of a building and site [to achieve many, but not all, of the current educational, building performance, and aesthetic qualities of a new school,] by upgrading or replacing a minimum of five major building systems and [performing widespread] may include educational or architectural enhancements.

As Executive Director for the Public School Construction Program from 2003 to 2016, I was directly involved in the development of the Limited Renovation project category. The proposed change will negate one of the primary intentions of the Interagency Committee on School Construction (the Committee) when it established the new category: to require that large projects to improve building performance also include substantial improvements to the instructional environment. I believe that information on the background of the current definition of Limited Renovation will assist the Interagency Commission on School Construction in making a decision regarding this consequential amendment.

When I entered service as Executive Director in April 2003, I was informed by Mr. Allen Abend, Chief for the Facilities Branch of the Maryland State Department of Education, of concerns regarding certain large projects undertaken by Baltimore County Public Schools (BCPS). The school system had carried out a facility condition assessment in the late 1990s, known as Perks-Reuter after the name of the engineering firm that performed the study. The assessment identified deficiencies in schools throughout the system, but the scope of the proposed corrections was limited to upgrading or replacing building systems; the educational adequacy of the facilities was not included in the assessments or the recommendations. By the spring of 2003 BCPS had largely completed improvements to the elementary school facilities and had begun its middle school capital program, to be followed by the high schools.

A tour organized by Mr. Abend in May 2003 with BCPS personnel, including the then-director of BCPS capital programs, showed that the elementary school projects already completed had improved building systems, but with virtually no improvements to the educational environment. In some cases, the investment into these older buildings was considerable, but the educational spaces remained undersized, inadequately equipped, poorly lighted, and with aging and aesthetically dispiriting finishes. In reality, these projects were multiple systemic renovations. The Committee staff determined that these large investments into improved building systems should also deliver a visibly improved learning environment.

As a result of staff recommendations, the Committee notified BCPS that it would no longer recommend multiple systemic renovation projects for funding to the Board of Public Works. It stipulated that in order for BCPS to receive funding for such projects, it would be required to expend a minimum of \$150,000 on educational enhancements, in addition to the expenditures to improve building systems. Since the State-approved cost of building construction in July 2003 was \$138.75/square foot, the required \$150,000 investment would be equivalent to approximately \$370,000 today. The Committee pointed out to BCPS a significant advantage in this arrangement: under the multiple systemic renovation format ancillary building components such as carpeting and painting were not eligible for State funding, but these items would become eligible under the new designation of the projects as renovations. Calculations were

developed to show that BCPS would benefit from increased State funding if it undertook renovation projects under the new requirement.

BCPS agreed to the change but discussion also began, involving the Committee, BCPS, the County Executive of Baltimore County, and the staff of other Maryland school systems, about introducing a new category called Limited Renovation to the list of approved project categories. The intent of the new Limited Renovation category was to encourage local educational agencies (LEAs) to undertake projects that would improve building performance and correct a substantial number of educational deficiencies, without undertaking the very expensive work involved in complete renovations. The language of the regulation (then-COMAR 23.03.01, Terminology) made this clear (emphasis added):

"Limited renovation" means to upgrade an existing building and site, or a portion of a building and site, to achieve many, but not all, of the current educational, building performance, and aesthetic qualities of a new school, by upgrading or replacing a minimum of five major building systems and performing widespread educational or architectural enhancements.

Building systems and spaces that were not included in the scope of the Limited Renovation project would be eligible for State funding participation within 15 years of the completion of the project. This was a significant difference between the new Limited Renovation category and traditional Renovation projects, and an incentive to LEAs to undertake these projects. The new project category was intended to help LEAs with extensive facility needs and restricted funding capacities to improve a larger number of schools than would be possible under the Renovation category. The improvements would have a far more significant impact on the educational environment than a series of separately funded Systemic Renovation projects. This is in fact what happened: Baltimore County Public Schools and several other school systems used the Limited Renovation category to great advantage, and concurrently improved the average age of the square footage in their systems, something not possible under a pure Systemic Renovation approach. Early improved schools included Catonsville High School in Baltimore County and Leonardtown Middle School in St. Mary's County.

The change of regulation currently proposed by the Interagency Commission would make the educational or architectural enhancements in a Limited Renovation project elective. Although an LEA could still perform a Limited Renovation in the original sense, it could also undertake a multiple systemic renovation project (while presumably receiving the benefit of the Renovation designation, for example the eligibility of the ancillary items mentioned). In this case, the distinction between a multiple systemic renovation and a Limited Renovation project would be nullified. The proposed change will remove a key objective of the original definition, the requirement to achieve the visible and substantial improvement of the educational environment. It would appear that the better course would be to establish a new formal category called Multiple Systemic Renovation, which would allow LEAs to combine several Systemic Renovation projects within one funding request, while preserving the distinction between a Renovation and a project that addresses multiple building systems.

I hope that this brief history will be helpful to the Interagency Commission in making its decision about the proposed change of definition. I will be happy to answer any questions on my understanding of the purpose and original objectives of the Committee in establishing the Limited Renovation project category. Sincerely,

- (6) Repeal existing Regulation .07, adopt new Regulation .07, and amend Regulation .09 under COMAR 27.02.05 State Agency Actions Resulting in Development on State-Owned Lands; and
- (7) Amend Regulation .01 under COMAR 27.03.01 Notification of Project Applications.

This action was considered by the Critical Area Commission for the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays at an open meeting held on August 5, 2020, pursuant to General Provisions Article, §3-302(c), Annotated Code of Maryland.

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this action is to modernize the drafting style of, update, and, where necessary, delete certain outdated provisions. The amendments generally affect the agricultural regulations where these regulations are located throughout COMAR Title 27. The proposal does not include any additional regulatory requirements of the affected regulated community.

27.01.01 General Provisions

Authority: Natural Resources Article, §§8-1806, 8-1808(c), and 8-1811, Annotated Code of Maryland

.01 Definitions.

 - (2) Agricultural Best Management Practice.
- (a) "Agricultural best management practice" means an agronomic, conservation, or pollution control practice, installation, or structure that manages soil loss, nutrients, animal wastes, or agricultural chemicals so as to minimize their movement into State waters.
- (b) "Agricultural best management practice" includes strip cropping, terracing, cover crops, grass waterways, animal waste management, conservation tillage, riparian buffers, nutrient management, and stream protection practices such as fencing, stream crossings, and remote watering devices.
- (c) "Agricultural best management practice" does not include a shoreline erosion control measure authorized by the Department of the Environment under COMAR 26.24.04.
 - (2-1) Agriculture.
- (a) "Agriculture" means [all methods of] an activity related to the production [and] or management of livestock, crops, vegetation, [and] or soil. [This includes, but is not limited to, the related activities of tillage, fertilization, pest control, harvesting, and marketing. It also includes, but is not limited to, the activities of feeding, housing, and maintaining of animals such as cattle, dairy cows, sheep, goats, hogs, horses, and poultry and handling their by-products.]
 - (b) "Agriculture" includes:
- (i) Tillage, harvest, fertilization, pest management, cropping, pasturing, or production of an agricultural product, including livestock, poultry, plants, trees, sod, food, feed, and fiber; and
- (ii) An activity that directly contributes to the production, conversion, processing, storage, or sale of agricultural products primarily generated on-site.

- (a) "Aquaculture" means the farming or culturing of finfish, shellfish, other aquatic plants or animals, or both, in lakes, streams, inlets, estuaries, and other natural or artificial water bodies or impoundments.
- (b) Activities include the hatching, cultivating, planting, feeding, raising, and harvesting of aquatic plants and animals and the maintenance and construction of necessary equipment, buildings, and growing areas.
