

School Mapping Data Standards Draft Version 2 (v2) Release

Review is appreciated by April 30, 2025 March 31, 2025

BALTIMORE, MD - The School Mapping Data Program, established in 2024 by House Bill 472 (2024 Md. Laws, Ch. 167), was created to provide funding to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) to produce school mapping data for each public Prekindergarten through Grade 12 school, including public charter schools. The school mapping data will enable the production of maps of school facilities that should be usable by multiple authorized stakeholders, including first responders in case of emergencies at a school and facilities management, funding, and oversight personnel. In January 2025, the IAC released an initial draft of the School Mapping Data Standards for the program for public comment. The IAC reviewed this feedback and is now releasing a revised draft for an additional 30-day comment period prior to the expected adoption of the final Standards in May of 2025 by the IAC.

Of note, the draft standards have been significantly streamlined into a single .pdf document <u>available</u> <u>here</u> for review.

Staff of the IAC and partner agencies appreciate the review of the standards by relevant LEA and State and local stakeholders by **April 30, 2025**. Feedback can be provided through <u>this form</u>.
